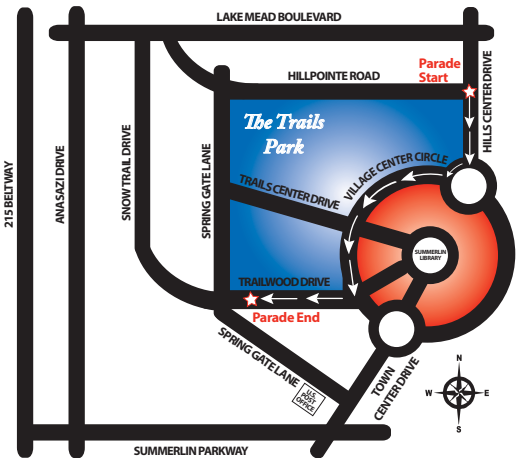


Patriotic Parade Route

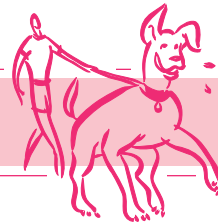

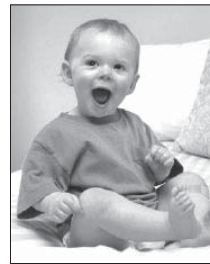

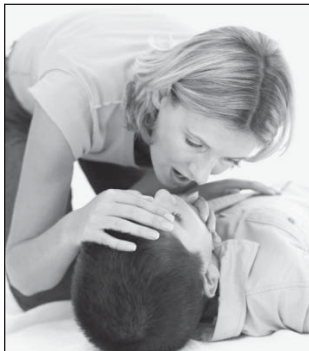

AMERICAN RED CROSS ADULT CPR/AED AND CHILD-INFANT CPR (INCLUDES FIRST AID OPTION)



The purpose of this course is to teach the lay responder how to provide the knowledge and skills necessary to help sustain life and minimize the consequences of injury or sudden illness for adults, children, and infants until more advanced medical help arrives. Participants will demonstrate care for choking, breathing, and cardiac emergencies

including performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and using an automated external defibrillator (AED) for victims of sudden cardiac arrest. The certification for this course will last one year. In addition to the CPR/AED, the first aid option will include giving individuals the knowledge and skills necessary to recognize and provide basic first aid care until advanced medical personnel arrive and take over. Care includes: soft tissue injuries (bleeding and burns); injuries to the muscles, bones, and joints; sudden illness; and heat/cold related emergencies. The certification for this course with the first aid option will last three years.

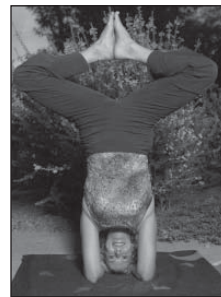

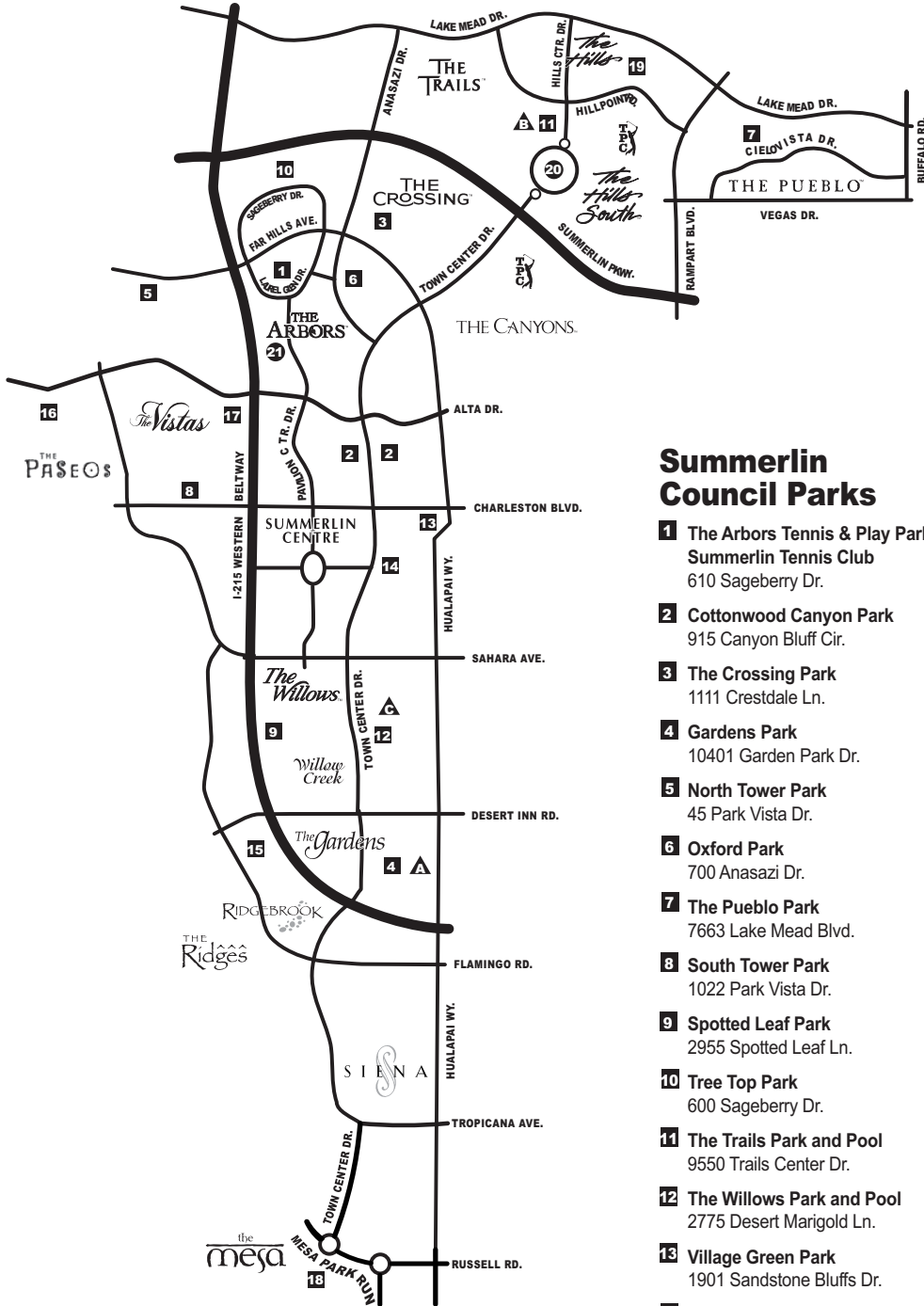

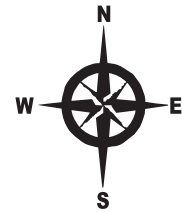
