More than 100 resident volunteers helped remove 40 tons of trash at the Summerlin Desert Clean-up on May 1.

## 40 Tons Of Trash Removed At Summerlin Desert Clean-Up

More than 100 resident volunteers, dozens of professional contractors and executives from The Howard Hughes Corporation, developer of Summerlin, removed 40 tons of landscape waste, construction spoils and trash on Saturday, May 1 along the western edge of development in Summerlin West. "The church's number of volunteers and caliber of work was impressive."

According to Rick Phillips, bishop for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and volunteer at the Summerlin Desert Clean-up, this event is one of many service opportunities promoted by church leaders. "We believe it's important to be active and serve in our communities," he said.

The Howard Hughes Corporation currently plans to coordinate two desert clean-up events annually each spring and fall. "It's important to us, as land owners, to protect and preserve our desert home," said Warden. "We hope more will join us in this worthwhile effort."

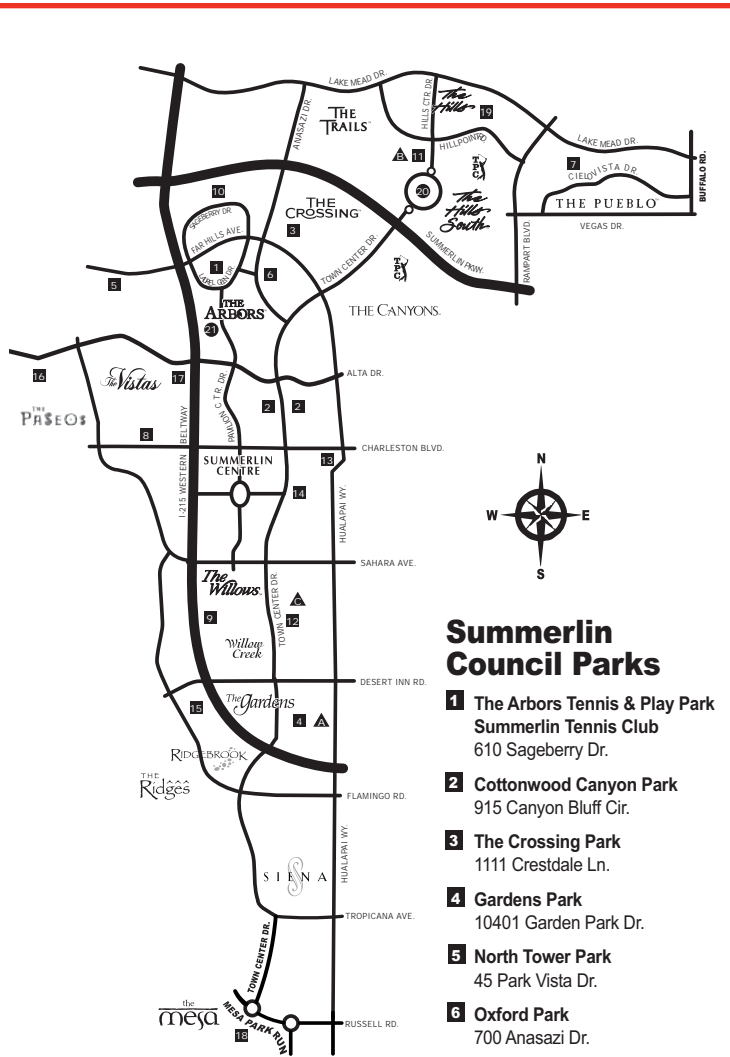

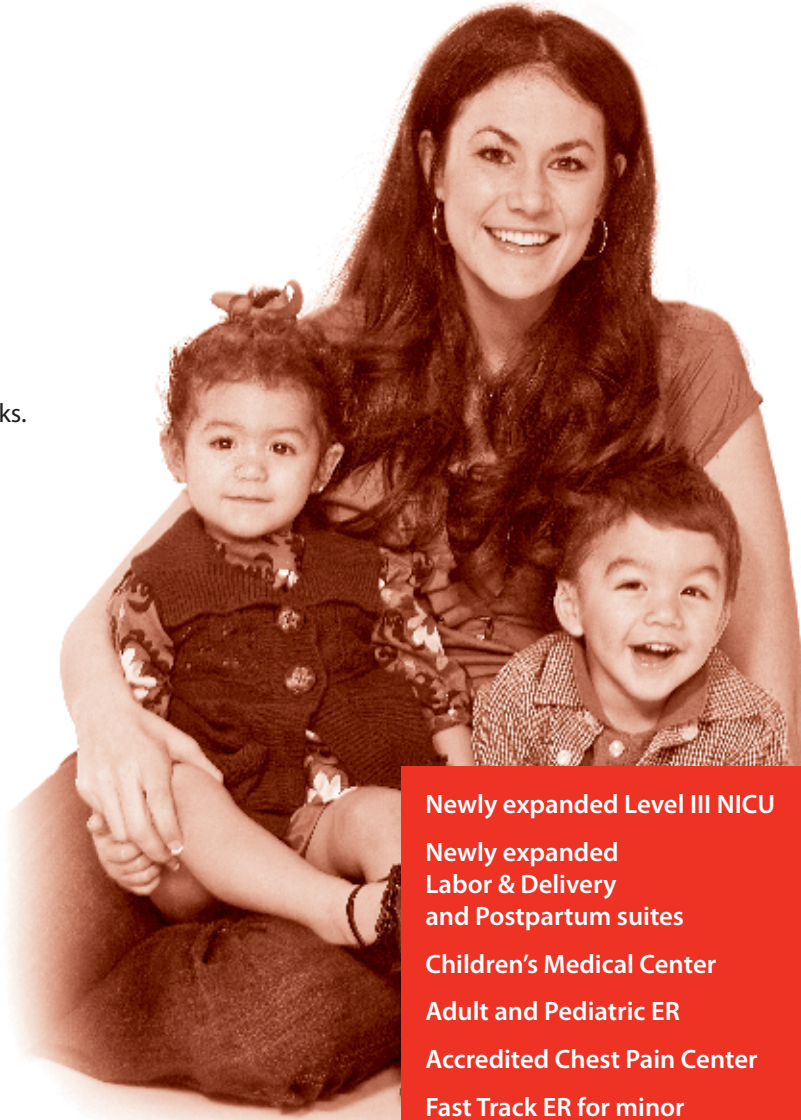
