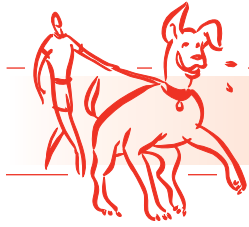
### INTERMEDIATE GUITAR

## Family & Home

### AMERICAN CANINE TRAINING - BASIC



American Canine Training provides basic obedience to improve the day-to-day relationship between dogs and their families. It also lays the groundwork needed to pass the optional A.K.C. Canine Good Citizens Test. Classes are based on the

dog's knowledge, not age or size, and are designed for dogs with little or no formal education. All dogs will learn manners including no barking, no digging, no jumping, no nipping and more. In addition, they will learn the basic commands: name game; sit; down; stay; come; leave-it; and loose-leash walking. A detailed description of each class is explained below:

**Week #1:** Orientation - No dogs please. This class is the canine manners seminar and orientation to prepare for the following five weeks. It includes an introduction to positive reinforcement and covers basic manners from bolting outdoors to excessive barking. If it's a problem, we discuss it in this class! (***This class only will be held inside the Trails Community Center.***)

**Week #2:** This class teaches the dog to focus on the pet-parent with the name game which is the cornerstone to a well-behaved pooch. It also teaches "sit," "down" and a "release word" so that dogs remain on command until the pet-parent says they can get up. Also covered is canine massage, with a relaxation cue which is used to reward or settle and relax the dog on command whenever necessary.

**Week #3:** This lesson covers learning to walk nicely on a leash so that dogs can be properly and pleasantly exercised.

**Week #4:** Week four includes the "stay" command, "leave-it" and "give." "Stay" helps the dogs

learn patience and boosts confidence. "Leave-it" teaches the dog not to take things without permission and "give" teaches the dog to relinquish anything in his mouth without a tug of war or chase.

**Week #5:** This class covers "come when called" and introduces the clicker as a training tool. Dogs develop a reliable recall and get to try a few tricks like "shake hands" and "roll over."

**Week #6:** All previous work is reviewed and a fun and informal "final exam" is administered before a graduation ceremony.

## ADULT CPR/AED AND CHILD-INFANT CPR CERTIFICATION (WITH FIRST AID OPTION)



This complete CPR course authorized by the American Red Cross, prepares you to recognize emergencies and make appropriate decisions for first aid care. Chapin Training Services, an authorized provider for the American Red Cross, teaches the lay responder the knowledge

and skills that individuals need to know to give immediate care to adults, children and infants until more advanced medical care arrives. Participants will learn and practice: checking a conscious person; checking an unconscious person; care for breathing/choking emergencies; CPR; AED (automated external defibrillator); soft tissue injuries; injuries to muscles, bones and joints; burns; heat/cold related emergencies; and sudden illness. Certification is issued upon successful completion of the class. The certification for CPR/AED is valid for one year. The First Aid certification is valid for three years.

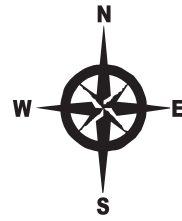
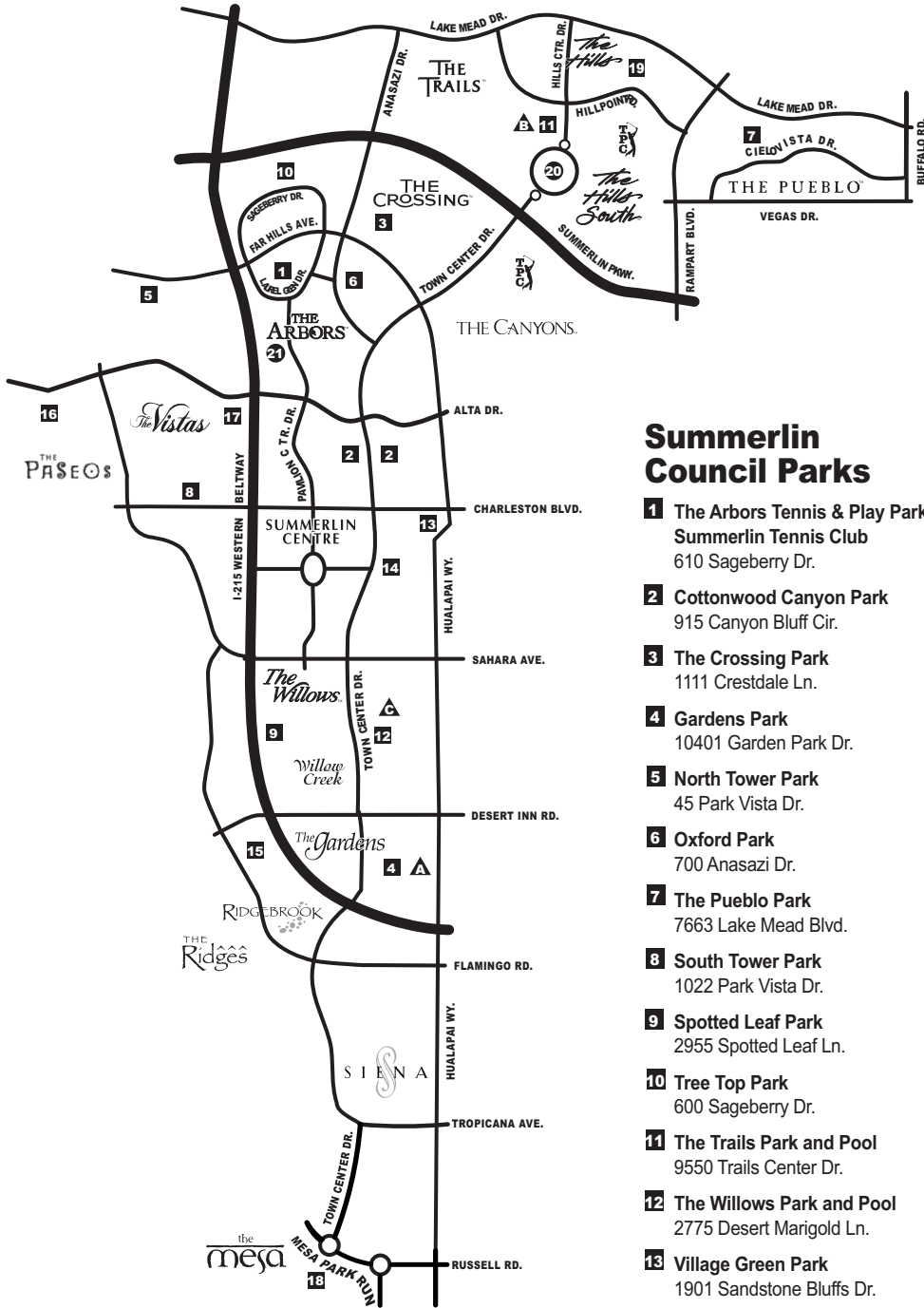

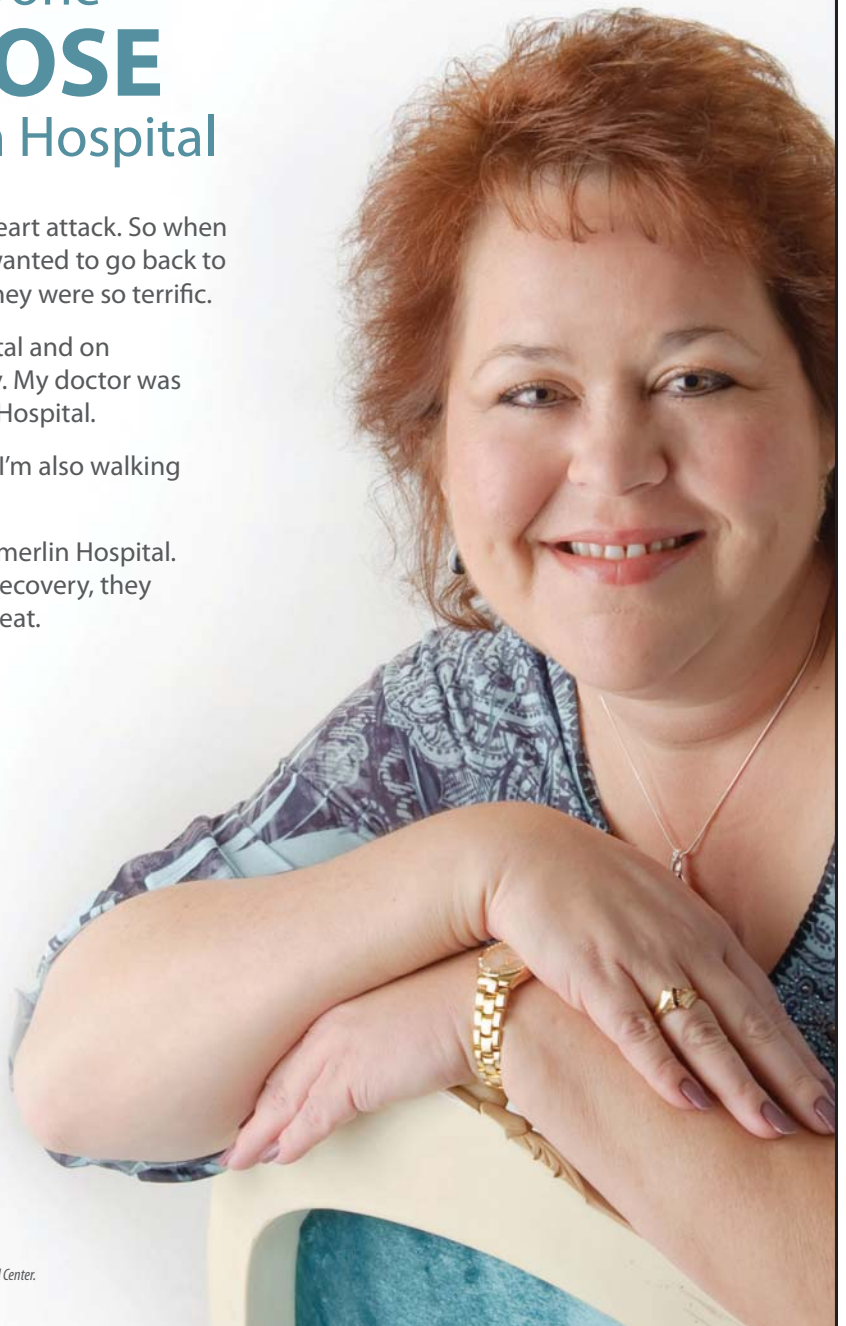
