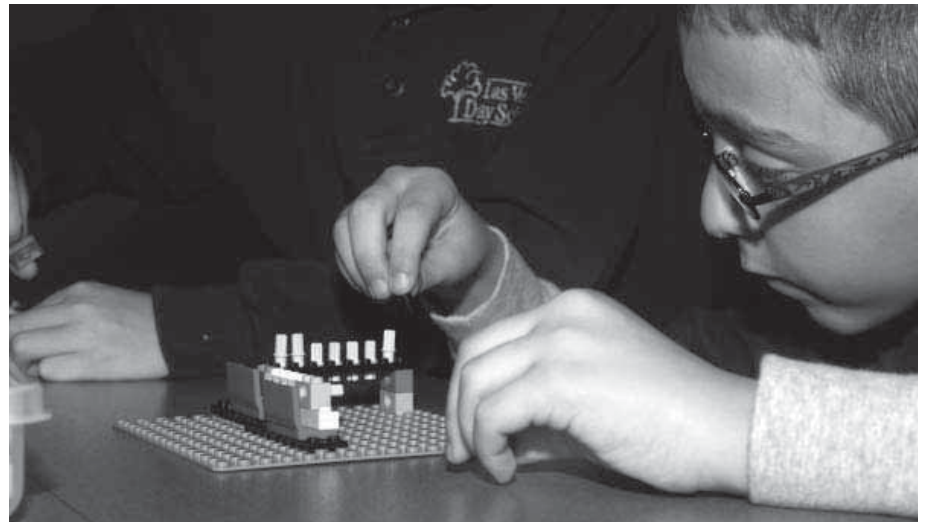

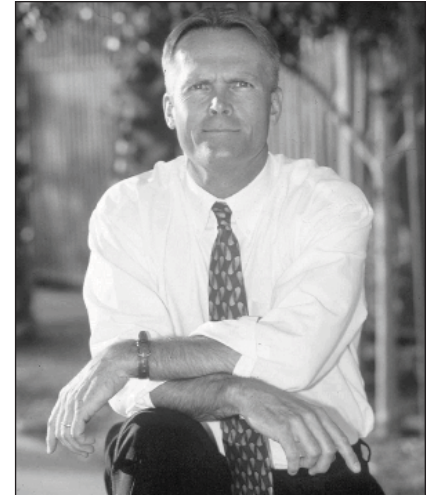

*Design Review Submittal and Approval Before You Start* – I can’t emphasize



enough how important it is for each of us to follow this requirement. As some residents have learned the hard way, plan submittal and approval prior

to installation are not only community requirements, but also an effective way to avoid costly re-modifications and bruised relationships with fellow neighbors. Questions, answers and project conditions of approval are less emotional and much easier to discuss among fellow residents and committee volunteers before any dollars are spent.

**Please Help Minimize On Street Parking** – Every effort should be made to organize your garage to accommodate as many vehicles as it was originally designed. Excess vehicles should be parked in the driveway. Parking in the street is highly discouraged. For your neighbor's sake please make a habit of using your garages and driveways. The safety and appearance of your neighborhood will be much improved.

**Report Your Concerns** – Your master associations will help you deal with a variety of compliance and common area maintenance issues. You also have resources at the City

and County levels. Clark County Code Enforcement can be reached at 455-4191; City of Las Vegas Neighborhood Response can be reached at 229-6615.

**Help To Avoid Needless Property Damage** – It is important that parents continue to convey to their children a proper sense of respect for property. Having to repair or clean up vandalism or graffiti after immature children is a waste of everyone's time and money.

**Safety in Numbers** - Keeping Summerlin safe and secure is a shared responsibility of both residents and our Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro). Please don't wait until you are a victim of a crime to heighten your awareness. The best way for each of us to keep our community streets and neighborhoods safe is to always exercise precaution and look out for each other.

If you should witness property damage to private property or common areas please pass the informa-

tion on to the proper party. Thanks to observant residents, our master associations have had some success in recovering funds from responsible parties.

At the end of the day, the physical appearance and sense of community within our Summerlin neighborhoods, parks and streetscapes is a direct reflection of our own efforts. Thanks for your help and keep up the good work. It shows...♥

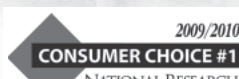

## MEETING SUMMARY BOARD OF DIRECTORS December 14, 2010

As properly noticed, the Summerlin West Community Association Board of Directors held their quarterly business meeting on December 14, 2010 at 10000 W. Charleston, Ste. 200. Board members present were: Peggy Chandler and Robert Carroll. The meeting was re-scheduled to December 14 as there was no quorum for the regular meeting in November and the meeting had to be re-noticed.

### MEETING SUMMARY

- Unanimously elected the following slate of officers: Peggy Chandler, President, Robert Carroll, Secretary and Brenda Grassley Treasurer. Peggy Chandler and Robert Carroll were appointed the Summerlin West representatives to the Summerlin Council Board of Directors.
- Each director signed their Director Certifications as required by the Nevada Real Estate Division.
- Unanimously approved the Consent Agenda, including

- (1) Minutes – August 10, 2010; (2) Summerlin West Financial Reports and Bank Reconciliations – July, August, September, 2010; (3) Barcelona-Mariposa Financial Reports and Bank Reconciliations – July, August, September, 2010; (4) Builder Closing Update; (5) Compliance Report, August, September, October 2010.

- Acknowledged the receipt of a letter from management advising the board to remain in compliance with NRS 116 and NAC 116 and all federal and state laws.
- Reviewed Groundskeeper landscape reports for the months of July, August, and September, 2010.
- Acknowledged the letter from Jonathan Friedrich and approved the letter sent by Mr. Ecklund in response.
- Unanimously approved the 2011 landscape contract for Barcelona Mariposa with The Groundskeeper with no increase in cost.
- Agreed to research the cost of a light for the Ashton Park mini-park and advise the homeowners in Ashton Park of the cost should they elect to install it at their cost.
- Agreed to research the cost of a gazebo light and a gate camera in Barcelona Mariposa Neighborhood at the expense for the Neighborhood.
- Unanimously approved the extension of the contract for landscape maintenance for 2011 with The Groundskeeper with no increase in cost.
- Unanimously approved the proposal from Hilburn and Lein for the 2010 audit and tax filing.
- Unanimously approved the management contract with The Howard Hughes Corporation for 2011 with a 5% reduction in cost.
- Approved quarterly Board of Directors meetings for the year 2011.
- Scheduled the next Board of Directors meeting for February 8, 2011 at 5:30 p.m.
- Heard homeowner comments requesting that the annual meeting follow the agenda as published and that all homeowner comments relate to Summerlin West business and issues; delegate voting; and compliments to management on how the annual meeting and board meetings are handled.

# Water Conservation

## Don't Let Leaks Drain Your Money Away

Leaks can be silent water and money wasters, but you can fight back with these tips from the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA).

**Toilet Leaks** - Does your toilet sound like it's running all day? You may have a leak. Follow these tips to find and stop toilet leaks. If you are not sure about your ability to perform any of these steps, please contact a licensed plumber.

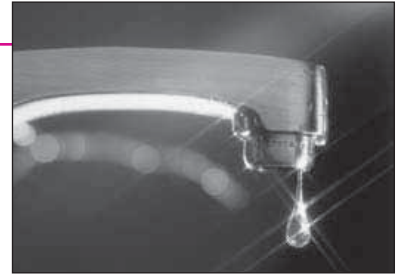
A continuous trickling sound usually means water is running over the top of the overflow tube inside the tank. The periodic sound of water being added to the tank usually means a leaky flapper at the bottom of the tank. This is usually the result of a worn rubber flapper that is allowing water to seep from the tank into the bowl and down the sewer. An improperly adjusted flapper chain also could cause the problem.

Conduct this simple dye test to see if water is seeping from the tank:

- Place a coloring agent such as food coloring or coffee in the toilet tank.
- The tank water will change color, while the toilet bowl water should be clear.
- Wait 10 minutes.
- Check to see if any coloration appears in the bowl. If so, then you have a leaking flapper valve.

**Leaky Faucets** - A leaky faucet can waste several gallons of water per day. In addition, a dripping faucet may deteriorate a sink bowl and provide moisture for ants, flies and other insects.

The best source of repair information for a specific product may be the manufacturer's website. However, most faucets have a similar assembly with the same basic parts.



A repair kit can be purchased at your local hardware store. The kit should include a special adjusting ring wrench, seals, springs and O-rings. Also, washer assortment kits may be more cost-effective than buying washers individually.

After fixing a leaky sink, installing low-flow aerators can reduce the amount of water coming out of your faucet by 50 percent, saving about 2,000 gallons of water a year for two faucets. You will still get a great stream of water and installation is easy.

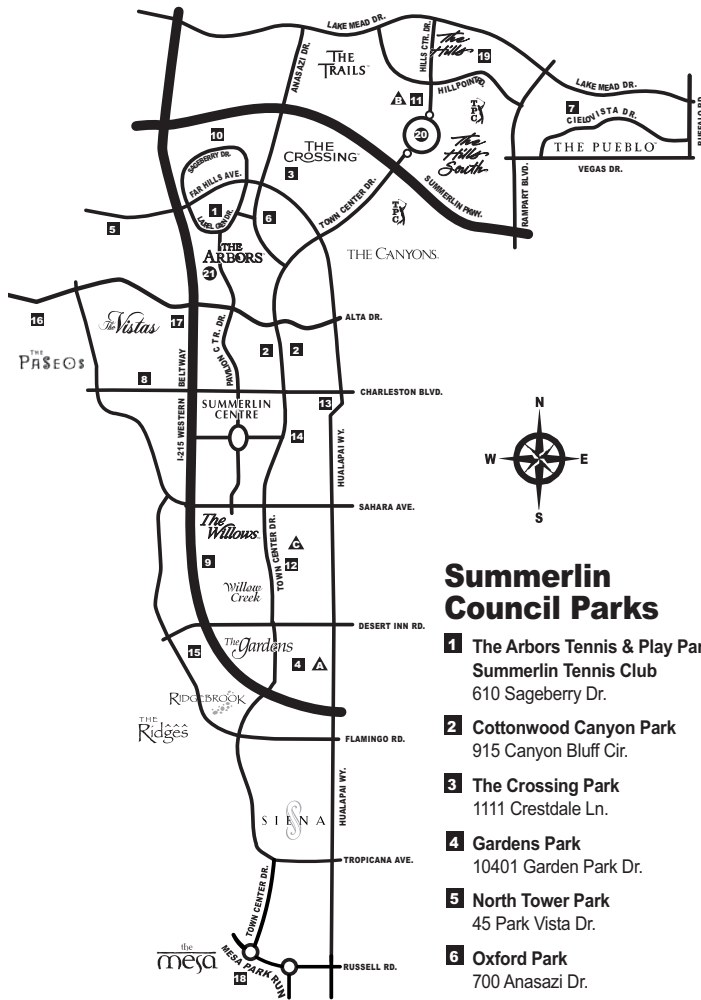
