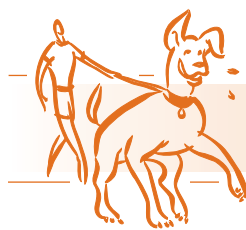

AMERICAN CANINE TRAINING – BASIC THROUGH AGILITY



American Canine Training is now offering our "Not so Basic" basic obedience class. This course provides tips for improving canine manners including no digging, no barking, no jumping and elimination of all other naughty dog

habits! It also offers all basic obedience commands including sit, down, stay, leave-it, come, and how to walk on leash. To keep things fresh, all commands are then used in conjunction with an introduction to Agility Equipment. Classes are based on the dog's knowledge, not age or size, and are designed for dogs with little or no formal education

Week #1: Please bring your dog on a buckle collar and six foot leash. You will also need to bring small, soft, smelly treats and a towel or small rug in case you need to sit on the ground. We'll begin with teaching you how to hold a leash properly and how to communicate with your dog in a manner he understands. We will also cover the concept of positive reinforcement and engage in canine human focus exercises.

Week #2: This class teaches the dog to focus on the pet-parent with the name game which is the cornerstone to a well-behaved pooch. It also teaches "sit," "down" and a "release word" so that dogs remain on command until the pet-parent says they can get up. Our first piece of agility equipment, the "pause table," is introduced.

Week #3: This lesson covers learning to walk nicely on a leash so that dogs can be properly and pleasantly exercised. The pause table will be reviewed and a low jump will be introduced.

Week #4: Week four includes the "stay" command, "leave-it" and "give." "Stay" helps the dogs learn patience and boosts confidence. "Leave-it" teaches the dog not to take things without permission and "give" teaches the dog to relinquish anything in his mouth without a tug of war or chase. Pause table

and low jump will be combined and the "tunnel" will be introduced.

Week #5: This class covers "come when called." Dogs develop a reliable recall and the "tire jump" is introduced.

Week #6: All previous work is reviewed and a fun and informal "final exam" is administered before a graduation ceremony. Dogs will also get to try a short agility course using a combination of all equipment introduced previously.

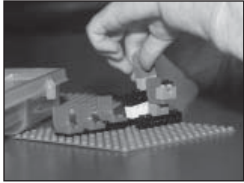

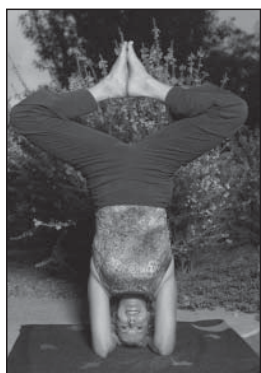
