If you see a problem or issue anywhere in Summerlin, please take the time to report it. Learn whom to contact for what so that the information gets to the correct person as quickly as possible. 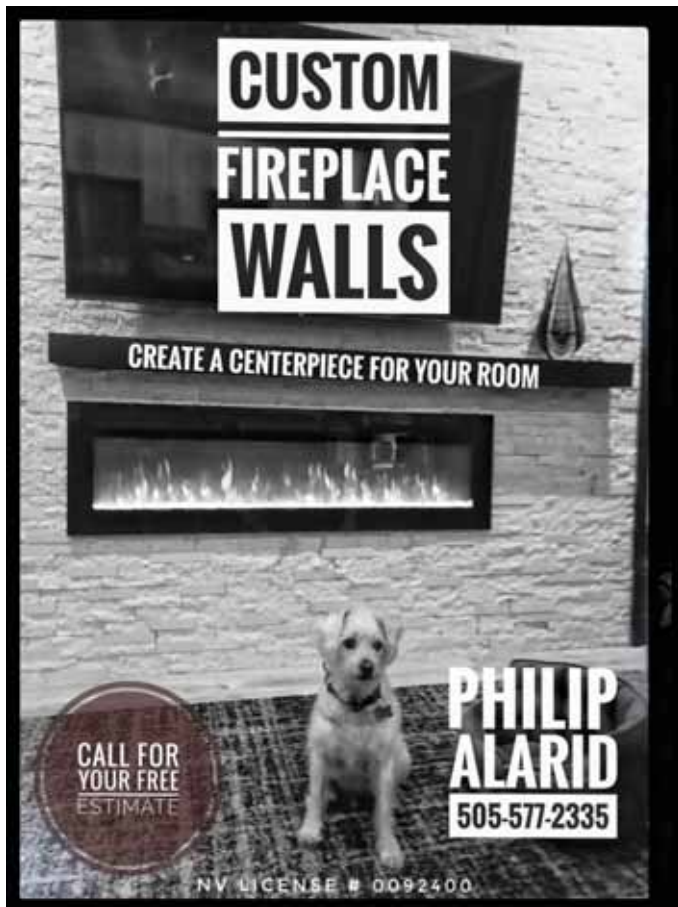

National Cyber Security Awareness Month

In today's digital age, Cyber Crime is the leading financial impactful crime all over the world. In addition to the financial loss victims suffer, the never-ending effects of having one's identity stolen or damage to one's credit. There are a variety of types of crime and here are some of the most popular:

- Spoofing – Fake websites or emails to mislead recipients and steal your personal information.
- Phishing – Emails or texts claim issues with your accounts and direct you to fake websites to compromise your personal information.
- Email scams – Victims asked to complete surveys, then prompted for personal account information which can lead to account compromise.

Below are some of the basic tips we offer to PREVENT one from being a victim:

- Do NOT respond to unsolicited (SPAM) emails or texts. Avoid clicking on links in unsolicited emails or texts.
- Be cautious of opening email attachments, especially from unknown senders.
- Do NOT provide personal information in email forms.
- Verify email links before clicking on them (hover your cursor over the link to reveal the true link).
- Visit official websites directly instead of clicking links
- Contact the business directly to verify the authenticity of emails.

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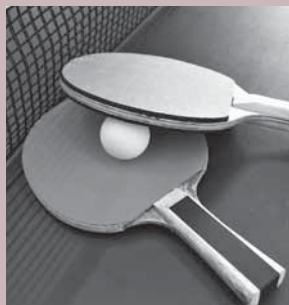

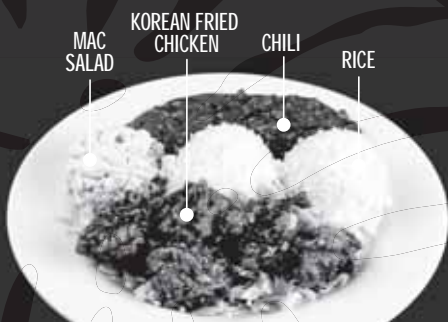
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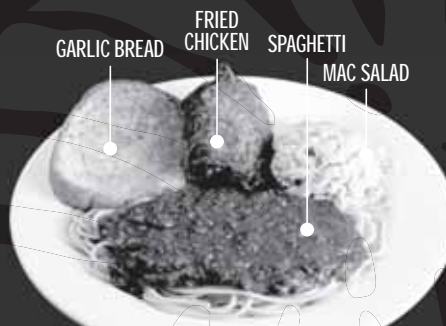

Follow The Fall Watering Schedule To Save Water And Money

Many things signal the arrival of fall—football's back, there's pumpkin spice on just about everything, and we're breaking out our warmer clothes. Fall also is a perfect time of year to save water by following the community's mandatory fall watering restrictions.

In effect from September 1 through October 31, the seasonal watering restrictions limit landscape irrigation to three assigned days per week. You can find your assigned watering days at snwa.com.

Watering outside of your assigned watering days can result in costly water-waste fines, and spray watering is prohibited on Sunday all year long.

To further boost conservation this fall and help manage your monthly bill, water plants and trees on a recommended two-day-a-week schedule, but for longer durations based on the flow rate of your emitters. Grass should be watered **ONLY** three days a week. While this may not sound like much, keep in mind that temperatures are getting cooler,

meaning your landscape can stay vibrant and healthy throughout the season with even less water than you think. Remember: Drip It, Don't Drown It!

If you have a grass landscape, be sure to continue running your spray irrigation systems during the early morning hours through October to help minimize water lost to evaporation, and avoid watering on windy or rainy days. And be sure to inspect and test your system on a regular basis to prevent overspray onto sidewalks and streets, which could result in a water-waste fee.
