Safety Starts at Home

s we know, our everyday safety starts with each of us looking out for each other. While preparing for the holidays and the many activities and celebrations that come with them, please remember that helping to keep things safe in Summerlin is an ongoing shared responsibility between each of us and the Las Vegas Metro Police Department (Metro). The following information is some of Metro's valuable advice regarding home and community safety.

Keep Garage Doors Closed – Many property thefts that take place are attributed to people leaving their garage doors open while unattended. Metro notes report of cars, bikes, golf clubs, and other valuables disappearing while residents go back inside their home or in the back yard while leaving garage doors open.

Always Lock Your Car – Whether you park your car in your garage or on the driveway or street, (garage please, thank you!) it is important that you keep your car locked and valuables out of sight. In addition to the potential loss of your vehicle, access to your home or garage by theft and use of your garage door opener is a pattern commonly seen by Metro.

Reporting Suspicious Behavior -

Metro often shares that if you notice something that strikes you as somewhat unusual, it probably is. If you witness something in your neighborhood out of the ordinary, such as vehicles wandering through with no apparent destination or new faces going house to house, please make a note of it for safety reasons. Please report your concerns to Metro and be prepared to provide them with information such as





HELPFUL INFORMATION REGARDING **COMMON HOMEOWNER TOPICS**

ummerlin West homeowners and residents have a multitude of relationships when it comes to reporting problems we encounter in our daily living. The following is some general information that may help when you are trying to decide who to contact.

All your homes are a part of the Summerlin West Community Association (the association). You are subject to all the governing documents of the master association, including CC&Rs, Bylaws and Design Criteria. Some typical issues that should be referred to the master association mav include:

- Problems in the common area of the association such as broken sprinkler heads, trash, damaged plant materials, graffiti, vandalism.
- Entry monument or lighting damage at entries that are not gated.
- Property not being maintained to the association Community-Wide Standards.
- Trash cans and/or sports equipment stored in the front yard.

- Improvement projects that have not been submitted to Design Review.
- An RV, boat, or trailer parked on a driveway or on the street.
- Inoperable vehicles on the driveway or yard.

Regarding complaints, a complaint form is available online at **summerlink.com** to submit your complaint. In addition, you can request a copy of the complaint form by calling 702.791.4600 and a form will be sent to you. As a reminder, complaints must be submitted to the association in writing on an official complaint form.

If you live behind a gate in a private sub-association, the above issues should also be referred to your sub-association as you have an additional layer of governing documents and perhaps additional rules that are more restrictive than the master association. If you do not know who your subassociation management company is, you are able to obtain the information by calling 702-791-4600 and identifying your sub-association. Management will do their best to provide you with your sub-association's contact information.

Some issues that arise for the association and the City of Las Vegas may include:

- · Barking dogs
- Weeds, debris, and grass higher than 8" inches
- Excessive number of vehicles at a property
- Obstructions on the sidewalks/streets

In addition to completing the association complaint form, you may want to contact Animal Control at 702.229.6348 for problems relating to animals, and Neighborhood Response Code Enforcement at 702.229.6615 for the other issues. In addition, you can email code enforcement by going to www.lasvegasnevada.gov.

Also, some of your concerns may be the primary jurisdiction of the City of Las Vegas and you'd want to follow the directions below for reporting. These may include:

- Inoperable or improperly parked vehicles in the public street.
- Trash cans, skateboard ramps, basketball hoops, construction materials or any item that is obstructing a part of a street or public sidewalk.
- Kids on motorized/electric devises and scooters.
- Conducting more than two garage sales in a calendar year.
- Loud party or noise at a nearby home or in a public area (Peace disturbance is a police matter and you should call 311 for response).

Hopefully the above information will be helpful in sending you in the direction that will provide you with the most effective help for some of the most common problems reported.

Winter Watering Schedule in Effect November 1 in Southern Nevada

It may not officially be winter yet, but as the calendar rolls over and cooler temperatures set in, it's time to change our landscape watering clocks to follow the community's mandatory winter watering schedule.

In effect from November 1 through February 28, the winter watering schedule limits sprinkler irrigation to one assigned day per week; sprinkler watering is prohibited on Sunday. Find your assigned watering day at snwa.com.

Saving water—and managing your monthly bill—is even easier during the winter when you run your drip irrigation system on a recommended schedule of once every seven to 14 days for 30 to 90 minutes. When it comes to drip irrigation, keep a simple five-word rule of thumb in mind: Drip It, Don't Drown It!

Here are more tips to help keep your landscape vibrant this winter while helping the community save water:

• Set your spray irrigation for grass to water during the mid-morning hours to avoid freezing.





- Water grass only on your one assigned watering day.
- Change the time on your irrigation clock to coincide with the end of Daylight-Saving Time on November 2.
- Following the seasonal watering restrictions year-round can help the average customer save up to \$300 annually on their water bills.

The amount of water we apply to our landscapes is critically important because it is used once and cannot be reclaimed. Conversely, the water we use indoors for cooking, bathing, and cleaning is reclaimed, highly treated, and returned to Lake Mead for reuse. This recycling process helps extend our community's water supply, making every drop count–especially outdoors.
