Happy 2026 on behalf of everyone at your Summerlin Area Command. We all hope you had a happy, healthy, and safe holiday season to close out 2025. As we begin a new year, our focus should remain on staying happy, healthy, and safe all year long. With that mind, February is "Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month." We have a lot of teens in our Summerlin community, and this is a great opportunity for us all to speak with them on the importance of maintaining healthy relationships.

Studies indicate that 1 in 3 teens in the U.S. will experience physical, sexual, or emotional abuse from someone they are in a relationship with prior to reaching adulthood.

Here are 10 Warning Signs of Teen Dating Violence:

- 1. Using insults, intimidation, or humiliation
- 2. Extreme jealousy, insecurity, or controlling behavior
- 3. Isolation from friends and family
- 4. Unwanted sexual contact of any kind
- 5. Explosive temper or unusual moodiness
- 6. Constantly monitoring social media activities of location
- 7. Invasions of privacy; showing up unannounced
- 8. Leaving unwanted items, gifts, or flowers
- 9. Abusing alcohol or drugs
- 10. Threatening or causing physical violence

If you have a teen in your life, speak with them honestly and openly about what healthy relationships look like. Take the time to recognize signs of abuse and look for changes in mood, appearance, or activities. If you or someone you know is a teen and in danger, there is help available. Local schools, religious and community groups offer teen dating violence prevention and intervention programs. And if an actual crime has been committed, please report it to LVMPD.

Water Conservation SNWA

Planning for Southern Nevada's Water Future



For the past quarter century, as climate change-fueled drought has reduced flows in the Colorado River, residents and businesses have united to extend our limited water supply by participating in myriad conservation programs offered by the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA).

As a result of these efforts, the community reduced its consumption of Colorado River Water by 36 percent between 2002 and 2024, even as our population increased by more than 829,000 residents. Still, declining water levels at Lake Mead—the source of 90 percent of our community's supply—are a reminder that we truly do not know what Mother Nature has in store for our future.

To address this uncertainty, the SNWA's Water Resource Plan serves as a road map to guide the community's long-term water supply and resource needs. An important element of the plan includes potential water resources that, if needed, can be tapped to assure a reliable supply for current and future Southern Nevada residents. These include:



NV LIC#0083143



Desalination: SNWA has engaged with other Colorado River Basin states and water users, the federal government and the government of Mexico to explore potential seawater desalination projects. While desalination remains a water resource option to augment existing water supplies in the future, SNWA continues evaluating challenges with permitting, environmental concerns, and overall costs.

Pure Water Southern California: The SNWA is working with the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) on this project that would reclaim up to 150 million gallons of water per day for reuse within MWD's service area beginning in 2032. In exchange, Southern Nevada would receive a portion of California's Colorado River supplies.

Water Banking: Through conservation, more than 2.2 million acre-feet (717 billion gallons) are stored within the local aquifer and Lake Mead, as well as in Arizona and California for Southern Nevada's future use.

2025 In Review

In 2025, Summerlin's 35th year, six neighborhoods sold out while 10 new neighborhoods opened, expanding on the community's already strong line-up of new home offerings by the nation's leading homebuilders. New to the community in the Kestrel and Kestrel Commons districts were Raven Crest by Toll Brothers, Mockingbird by Lennar, and Sandpiper by Lennar. Grand Park village welcomed Ashland by Taylor Morrison, SHAWOOD at Arcadia, Glenrock by Toll Brothers, Caldwell Park by KB Home, Carlisle by Tri Pointe Homes, Primrose Park by Richmond American Homes, and Brantley by Pulte Homes.

Astra, a custom homesite enclave perched at the base of the La Madre Peaks mountains atop the northwest edge of Summerlin, also made its debut in 2025. At completion, Astra will feature 167 private and expansive custom homesites across 171 acres, positioned at the valley's highest point with stunning 360-degree views.

Three new parks opened in 2025: Redpoint Arroyo phases two and three; Kestrel Creek Arroyo, and The Hub in Kestrel Commons. Noteworthy office leases and businesses new to Summerlin in 2025 included GFiber and Eide Bailly at the Meridian office building, and Whole foods Market and Starbucks at Corner Retail Center.

Joining the retail line-up at Downtown Summerlin in 2025 were 11 brands – including a few new to the market. The new openings included Chanel Beauty, Whole Foods Market, Glam House, Skin Laundry, Popmart, Starbucks, Great Greek, Bake, BYLT, Alo, Vuori and Paris Baguette.

Roseman University College of Medicine, located in Summerlin near Town Center Drive and the 215 Beltway, welcomed its first class of future physicians in July and announced an ambitious three-phase plan to expand its Summerlin campus in tandem with the medical school's growth.

Looking Ahead to 2026

This year, 11 new neighborhoods are anticipated to open across the Kestrel and Kestrel Commons districts, Grand Park village, Summerlin Centre, and the community's newest village – La Madre Peaks. New parks slated to open this year will include Bluebird Park in the Kestrel district, Grand Park's first phase – Council Park – in Grand Park village; and Terrace Park, also in Grand Park village.

In October, the beloved annual Summerlin Festival of Arts celebrates a major milestone: its 30th anniversary, Oct. 9-11, 2026.




