A View Beyond Walls And Fences



Regarding Property Views:

Master association governing documents focus on integrity, architectural harmony, and the community-wide standard. Unless specifically stated in the master association governing documents, their focus is not on preserving a resident's line of sight over another resident's land and/or master association common area. A view, while desirable, is generally considered incidental and not guaranteed. As you know, trees grow, neighbors build additions, and landscapes evolve. Purchasing a home with a view does not freeze surrounding properties in time.

When your neighbors' improvements comply with master association governing documents and design standards, then the improvements are permissible acts of ownership that do not violate association standards simply because a view changes. To consider restricting such improvements based solely on a neighbor's preferred view would set a dangerous precedent. This approach would elevate subjective enjoyment over objective property rights of all residents. Simply put, neighbors do not have the right to veto another neighbor's property improvement.

Regarding Perimeter Walls & Fences:

Your Summerlin community perimeter walls and fences are more than just a boundary; they are a symbol of unity,

privacy, design harmony and offer village identity. However, for homeowners with a community perimeter wall or fence condition bordering their property, one thing is certain; modifications to these perimeter walls and fences are prohibited by each master association. This approach has been consistently applied since the beginning of Summerlin, and the intent has always been to maintain community uniformity, and this remains a "core value" to the continued success of Summerlin.

Perimeter community walls and fences are either owned by the master association, sub-association, the Summerlin Council, or the homeowner. Perimeter community walls and fences symbolize the character of an individual community, making it essential to preserve the original builder's design and structure. But with the rising desire for personalization in home improvement projects, homeowners often question whether the restrictions on these walls and fences are too stringent when owned by the homeowner.

For the most part, the restriction on modifications to community perimeter walls and fences is about more than aesthetics. These walls and fences play a critical role in the overall design of the community, providing a consistent visual line that is intended to benefit all homeowners. To contemplate allowing individual homeowners to alter a perimeter fence, whether by adding decorations, windscreens, installing gates, or changing its height, would disrupt the visual harmony of the entire community. Additionally, there often can be an underlying concern about long-term structural integrity and safety of a modified wall or fence.

Ultimately, the restriction on modifying perimeter walls and fences is a safeguard to preserve the original design and structural integrity of each community wall and fence. While the desire for personalization is understandable, these rules are in place for a purpose. By respecting these boundaries and focusing on alternative areas for improvement, homeowners can still make their property unique while contributing to a well-maintained, thriving Summerlin community.

Distracted Driving Awareness Month



As we enter Spring, please note that April is “National Distracted Driving Awareness Month.” It is a nationwide observance to highlight the dangers of the various activities that take our focus from driving - doing tasks such as texting, eating food, drinking beverages, and adjusting the radio. Statistics show thousands are killed and injured each year in crashes where the driver was distracted, with cell phone usage being the leading cause. In 2023 alone 3,275 people were killed in crashes involving distracted driving in the U.S.

Here at home in the Las Vegas Valley, we are currently battling record levels of fatalities on our roadways and need the help of every member of our community to combat these avoidable tragedies. Now is the best time to take responsibility for the choices we make when on the road.

Here are some simple tips to follow for a safe ride:

- Need to send a text? Pull over to a safe location and park. A few moments of your time can help you avoid crashing.
- If you have passengers in your vehicle, recruit them to be your “designated texter” who can send or respond to phone calls or text messages.
- Don’t touch your phone while driving. Don’t scroll through apps, stream music, watch videos, etc.
- Can’t resist the urge? Put your phone in your glove compartment, trunk, or in the back seat of your vehicle until you get to your destination.

LVMPD is stepping up their efforts in enforcing traffic laws. Following these safety tips can make sure you arrive safely to your destination but can also help you avoid seeing flashing red and blue lights behind you and issuing you a citation for unsafe driving. Let’s all work together to make Summerlin a safer community on our roads!

Water Conservation SNWA

Spring into Water Savings



Spring's arrival in Southern Nevada signals the start of a new watering season, but warmer weather doesn't mean your landscape needs maximum water right away.

In effect from March 1 through April 30, the community's mandatory seasonal watering restrictions limit watering grass with spray irrigation to up to three assigned days per week, for 12 minutes each day, ideally divided into three cycles of four minutes each set one hour apart. And remember, sprinkler watering is prohibited on Sunday.

Drip irrigated plants and trees need much less water and should generally be watered no more than two days per week during spring; consider slowly ramping up your watering schedule as temperatures rise and plants show signs of need. Find your assigned watering days at snwa.com.

Watering outside of your assigned schedule or allowing water to spray or run off onto sidewalks or streets can result in water waste fines. To avoid potential water-waste fees, turn your system off on windy and rainy days and inspect it regularly for leaks.

You also can save water and money by replacing thirsty grass with drip irrigated landscaping through the Southern Nevada

Water Authority's Water Smart Landscapes Rebate Program (WSL). Qualifying single-family property owners can earn a cash incentive of \$5 for each square foot of grass upgraded to water-efficient plants and trees up to the first 10,000 square feet converted and \$2.50 per square foot thereafter.

WSL participants may also qualify for the Tree Enhancement Program, which provides a \$100 bonus for each new tree installed. Additional cash rebates may be available through your local water provider, so be sure to check with them for any supplemental incentives.

Outdoor water use in Southern Nevada makes up about 60 percent of all residential water use, and nearly all water waste occurs outdoors. Unlike indoor water, water used outdoors is not reclaimed and returned to Lake Mead, making efficient landscape watering especially important.

By following the seasonal watering restrictions and choosing water efficient landscapes, you can play an important role in conserving Southern Nevada's most valuable resource.
