## A Healthy Dose of Spring Fever



With the arrival of spring comes a noticeable increase in activity throughout our community. A brief drive through Summerlin reveals a variety of projects underway, including new residential construction, ongoing roadwork, streetscape landscape installations, and park renovations and enhancements. This seasonal momentum often inspires homeowners to begin improvements of their own, whether planned well in advance or prompted by a ticking one-year clock. As many residents are preparing to undertake exterior projects, I would like to take this opportunity to provide a few important reminders and best practices to help ensure a smooth and successful process for everyone.

### Design Review Protocol

From time to time, the excitement of beginning a new project can lead homeowners to unintentionally overlook one of the association's fundamental requirements. At the time of purchase, each homeowner agreed to comply with the governing documents, including the requirement that any modification affecting the exterior appearance of a property must receive prior written approval from the association. This requirement applies to all exterior improvements, including, but not limited to, front and rear yard landscaping, patios, shade structures, pools, play equipment, and exterior structural/aesthetic modifications.

The Design Review process exists to help maintain the overall aesthetic consistency and property values within the community, while also ensuring that improvements meet established standards. On behalf of the volunteer members serving on your Board of Directors, Compliance Committees, and Design Review Committees, we strongly encourage all homeowners to submit a complete improvement request form and obtain approval **prior to commencing any work**. As a reminder, master association improvement request forms are located online at [www.summerlink.com](http://www.summerlink.com).

Please keep in mind that addressing feedback or required modifications during the review phase is significantly more efficient and far less costly than making changes after installation or construction has already taken place. Taking the time to follow the proper process helps avoid unnecessary delays, additional expenses, and potential compliance issues.

### Being a Good Neighbor

While community living does not require social engagement, it does come with shared responsibilities that contribute to the overall quality and appearance of each neighborhood within. Homeowners are expected to maintain their properties in a clean, safe, and attractive condition. This includes routine landscape maintenance, upkeep of exterior features, and periodic repainting or repairs as needed. Consistent maintenance not only preserves individual property values but also enhances the collective appeal of the neighborhoods.

Parking and street use are also important considerations. Neighborhoods are designed with garages and driveways to accommodate residents' vehicles and to keep the streets open and accessible. When streets become lined with parked vehicles, it can create unnecessary congestion, reduce visibility, and impact overall safety, particularly for pedestrians, cyclists, and children at play. Residents are encouraged to utilize their garages and driveways

whenever possible and to be mindful of how parking habits affect neighbors and the broader community.

Pet ownership carries additional responsibilities. All pet owners are expected to ensure that their animals do not create excessive noise disturbances and that all pet waste is promptly and properly cleaned up. These simple, everyday practices reflect courtesy and respect for fellow residents and shared spaces.

### Awareness and Safety

As activity levels increase during the spring and summer months, so do the presence of pedestrians, children, vehicles, e-bikes and e-scooters throughout the community. Residents are encouraged to remain attentive and exercise caution while navigating the community streets and parks. A heightened awareness of your surroundings helps contribute to a safer environment for all. By working together and remaining considerate of one another, we can continue to advance our community in a manner that is both welcoming and well-maintained.

Thank you for your continued cooperation and commitment to maintaining the standards that make Summerlin a desirable place to live. Your efforts, both large and small, play an important role in preserving the character, safety, and overall quality of our community. 🏞️

## Trail Smart: A Guide to Safe Hiking



Spring has arrived in Summerlin, bringing with it perfect weather and a renewed invitation to explore the outdoors. Surrounded by stunning desert landscapes, our community offers easy access to some of Southern Nevada's most scenic hiking opportunities. Just a short drive away, Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area draws hikers of all skill levels—from casual walkers to seasoned adventurers—eager to experience its natural beauty.

While hitting the trails is a wonderful way to enjoy the season, preparation is key to making every hike a safe one. With guidance from our valued partners at Red Rock Search and Rescue, here are essential safety tips every hiker should keep in mind:

Before you head out, be sure to pack the “10 Essentials” for hiking. Navigation tools such as a map, compass, or GPS are critical, as trails can sometimes be unclear. Protect yourself from the desert sun with sunscreen, sunglasses, and a hat, and bring extra layers in case temperatures drop unexpectedly. A reliable light source, like a headlamp or flashlight with extra batteries, is important in case your hike runs longer than planned.

You'll also want a basic first aid kit for minor injuries, as well as waterproof matches or a lighter for emergencies. A small repair kit or multi-tool can come in handy if gear breaks along the way. Don't forget to bring more food and water than you think you'll need, especially in warmer months, when hydration is critical. Finally, pack an emergency shelter such as a space blanket or lightweight tarp for added protection.

When hiking specifically in the Red Rock area, a few additional precautions can make all the difference. Carrying a whistle is a simple but effective way to signal for help if needed. Plan to start your hike early in the day to avoid peak desert heat, and if you do become lost, remember to stay put and make yourself visible rather than wandering.

With a little preparation and awareness, you can fully enjoy the beauty that surrounds us this season. Stay safe, stay smart, and happy hiking!

### Pool Season Passes

Pool season passes may be purchased online for \$40 for ages two and older and \$7 for ages one and younger beginning April 2. A valid Summerlin resident I.D. card is required for purchase. Each season pass entitles the cardholder unlimited access to the Trails, Willows and Vistas Community Pools through the duration of the pool season.

### Daily Fees

Daily visit passes may be purchased online at [summerlink.com/community/pools](https://summerlink.com/community/pools) beginning Wednesday, April 22. On the day of your visit, you are required to bring your resident I.D. card along with a copy of your receipt (paper or digital) to enter the pool.

Guests are limited to one resident per visit and only will be admitted when accompanied by that resident. Guest visits are \$7 each and must be purchased online.

## Co-Ed Summer Softball League



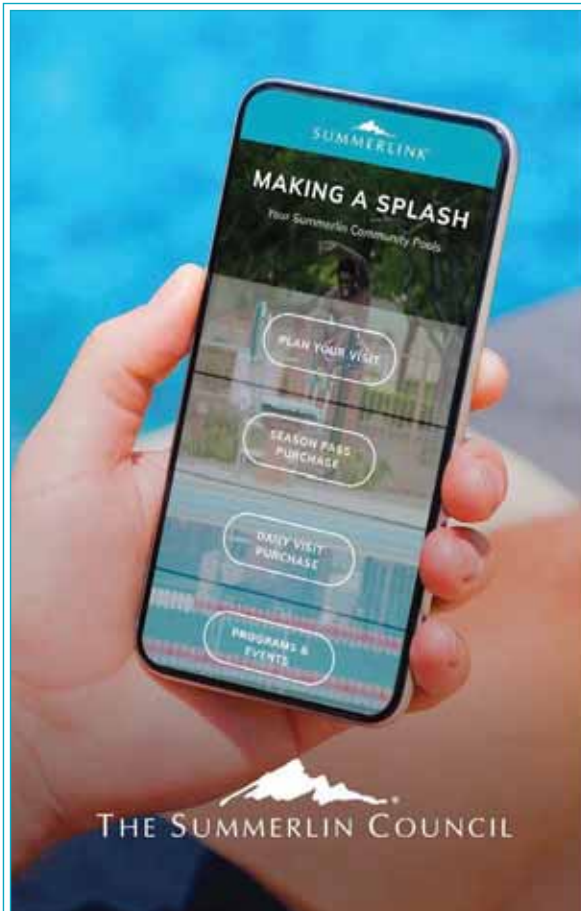

## Tips to Keep Your Landscape Happy and Healthy This Summer



Another scorching Southern Nevada summer is around the corner, and even though we're in for some long hot days ahead, it's important to balance your landscape's watering needs.

While you may be tempted to overwater, keep in mind that even during the hottest months of the year, your plants and trees can stay vibrant and healthy—and add colorful curb appeal to your property—with proper irrigation.

As the community's mandatory summer watering restrictions take effect from May 1 through August 31, follow these handy tips to maintain your landscape while efficiently using water and managing your water bill:

- Follow a recommended four-day-a-week schedule for drip-irrigated trees and plants, watering 30 to 90 minutes once per watering day.
- As temperatures rise and weather conditions dictate, slowly “ramp up” the number of days you water per week. Add additional watering days, if your plants and trees need them.
- Water grass with sprinklers for a maximum of 12 minutes per watering day, set in three four-minute cycles, spaced one hour apart. That's all your grass needs.
- Grass can be watered up to six days a week in summer; Sunday watering is not allowed year-round.

Sprinkler irrigation is prohibited between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. during the summer months, when water can be lost to intense heat and high winds. And remember—watering during prohibited hours or allowing water to spray or flow off your property could result in a costly water-waste fine (and nobody wants that).

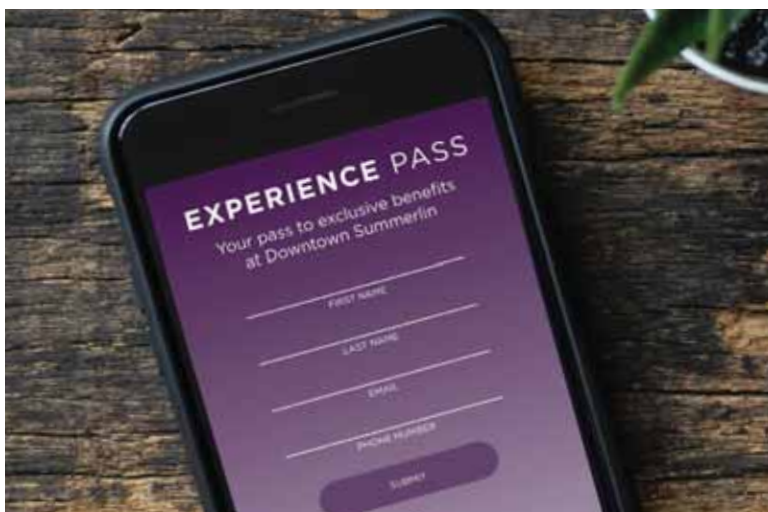

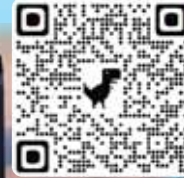

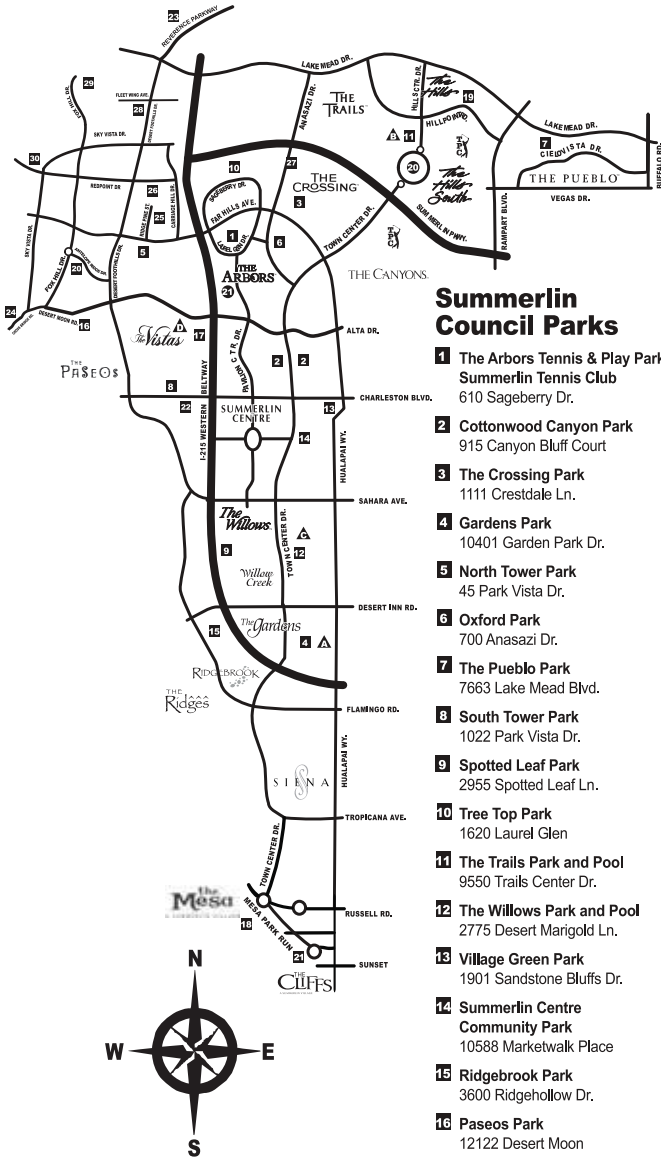
