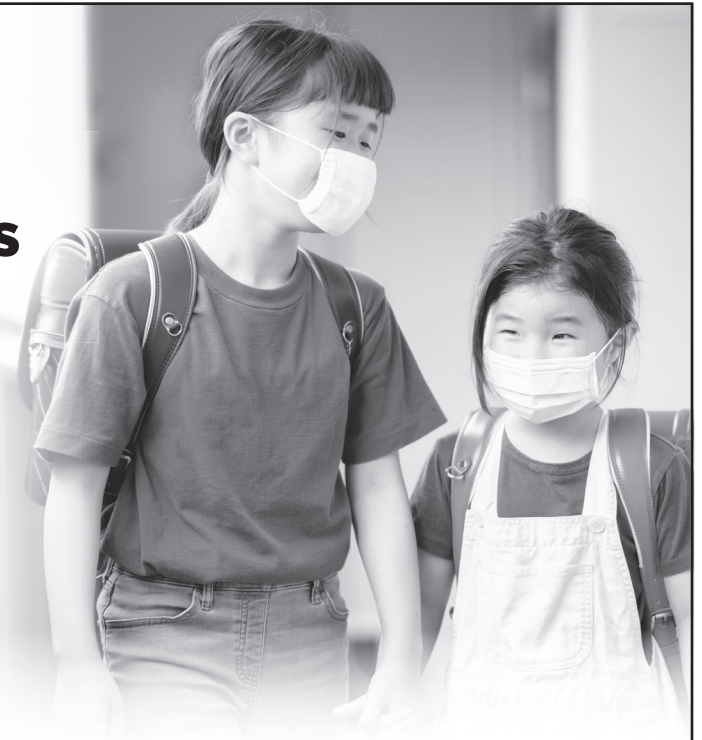

ARE YOU PLANNING TO REPAINT YOUR HOME?

How do I submit to repaint the exterior of my home? In answering this common question, please note that there is no pre-approved paint scheme for any residential properties in Summerlin West. All requests to alter the exterior color scheme of individual properties are reviewed on a case-by-case basis with consideration being given to the architectural style of the residence, the color of existing roof tile and/or stone veneer on the residence, the number of contrasting colors originally on the home, the color palette of the surrounding neighborhood, etc. The use of original paint colors in the original locations is considered routine maintenance and does not require approval.

The specific procedures and information for submitting your painting request are described in Article V., Section B. of the Association's Design Guidelines and Standards. When submitting you must provide the following: A completed Improvement Request form. (a copy of this form is located on Summerlink.com/Homeowners/Summerlin West/Design Review/Improvement Request Form).

A blocking plan/elevation drawing detailing which colors will be used on the exterior surfaces of the home. An accurate set of paint chips showing the name and manufacturer's code for each of the proposed colors. Confirm the paint colors selected is not the same color scheme as your neighbors to the immediate right, left and directly across the street from your residence.

In an effort to ensure the review process is effectively administered and that individual property owners are treated equitably; we review submittals only in the order they are received. ☀

Southern Nevada Water Authority

Summer Landscape Watering Restrictions

With summer right around the corner, the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) reminds residents and businesses to continue doing their part to conserve our region's limited water supply by adhering to the community's mandatory seasonal watering restrictions.


In effect through August 31, the summer seasonal restrictions prohibit landscape irrigation between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday, when water can be lost to intense heat and high winds; to avoid water loss, the SNWA recommends you water your landscape in the early morning hours before sunrise to reduce evaporation. Also, watering on Sunday is prohibited year-round.

While the summer restrictions allow landscape watering up to six days a week for grass, residents should "ramp up" lawn watering from three days a week as the weather gets warmer. Use the cycle-and-soak method by watering in three 4-minute cycles each day with a 1-hour break between cycles.

Meanwhile, you should continue irrigating desert-



adapted plants from two to four days a week with drip irrigation as water-efficient plants have different needs than grass and can thrive on less water even in hotter temperatures. Over-watering plants and shrubs can do more harm than good.

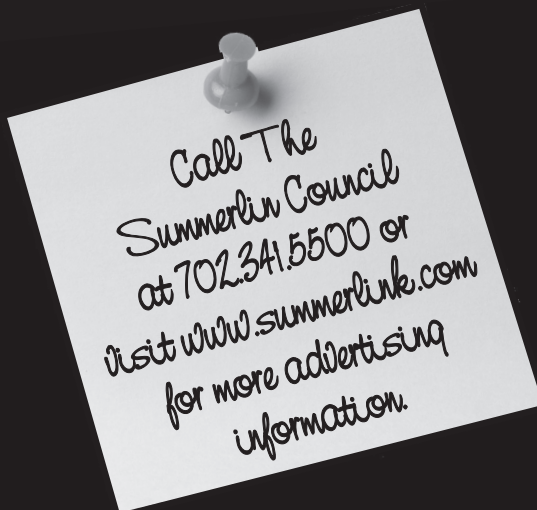

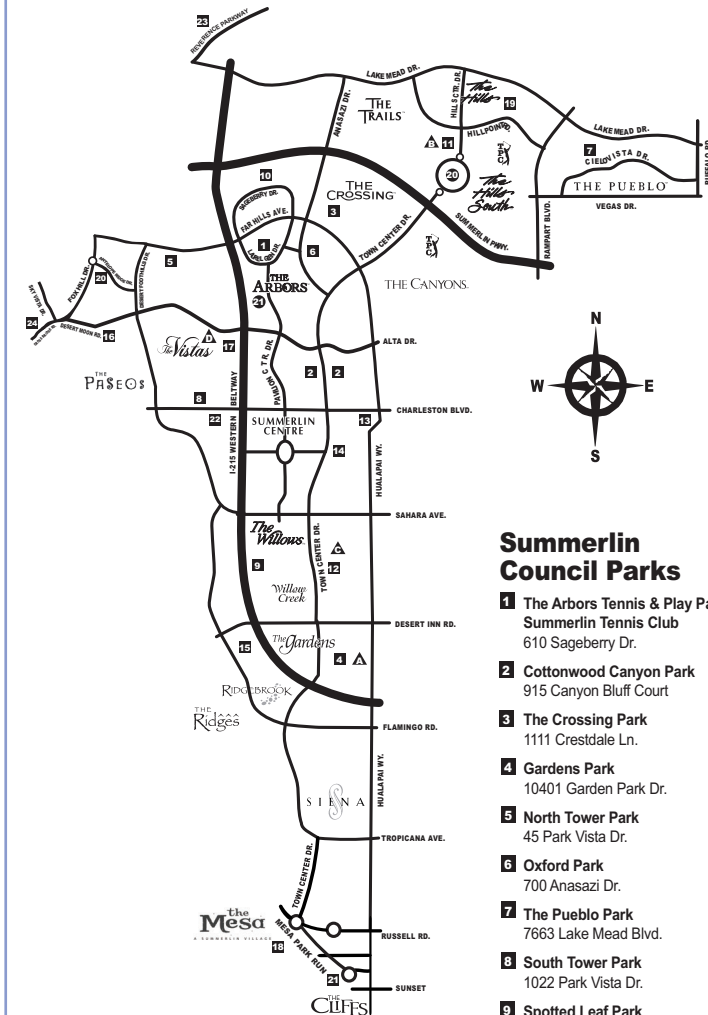
