Please Remember Our Park Use Permits Program

As part of our well-earned temporary euphoria, Summerlin Council parks are once again experiencing a high level of group use. On recent occasions we have encountered individuals or organizations inviting extremely large groups of people to a park for "their" special activity. While the Summerlin Council certainly understands and appreciates the community spirit and intent in which these large

gatherings or events were conceived, the reality is that such activities can quickly overwhelm certain parks and make it very difficult, if not impossible, for other residents to also enjoy the community amenity. Quite simply, each of our Summerlin parks has its own design characteristics and proper capacity limitations and therefore not all parks are well-suited for handling especially large crowds or special events.

Please Note:

Due to early publishing deadlines, Board meeting summaries included in Summerlines may reflect meetings held six to eight weeks prior.

Experience has shown us that these inappropriate sized gatherings in smaller venues often lead to unsafe traffic patterns, unsafe parking and pedestrian conditions, highly inadequate levels of restroom facilities for all visitors, extreme trash and noise issues and the highly justified frustration of fellow residents or park neighbors attempting to use the park for their own peaceful enjoyment.

To avoid this particular issue and the various challenges it can bring, please be reminded that the Summerlin Council has developed and adopted a park use permit program. Any group of more than 100 people is required to apply for and secure a Park Use Permit from Summerlin Council in order to stage their activity in a Summerlin park. We have found that this approach allows our park staff to better assist residents and organizations by helping them to align their large group with the appropriate size park for their specific gathering. I should also note that due to constant demand, not all large group activities can or will be accommodated. Our goal remains trying to make things a little better every day for our residents and, as always, your continued understanding and cooperation is greatly appreciated. Thanks for your help and I hope you are having a great summer! 🔶 GNMAWYA

SUMMERLIN SOUTH COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES

There are predominantly two documents that define the Community Wide Standards for Summerlin South. These are the *Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Reservation of Easements,* which contain the use restrictions, and the *Design Guidelines and Standards* that provide guidance to homeowners wishing to make improvements and modifications to the exterior of their homes or their landscaping. These documents are provided to each purchaser at the time they close escrow on their homes. In addition, some can be found online at **www.summerlink.com**. Click on the "Residents" button at the top, and then "Summerlin South Community Association."

In order to provide the due process *required under Nevada Law*, if a violation of the Summerlin South Governing Documents is suspected, the steps available to the association to achieve resolution are:

- 1. Friendly neighbor-to-neighbor contact which often will resolve the matter quickly and easily. If such contact is unproductive, deemed to be unwise, or inappropriate, then:
- 2. Violations must be reported in writing. Visit summerlink.com, scroll to the very bottom and select "Contact Us," then "Community Complaint Form."
- 3. If the violation is verified, a Courtesy Letter will be sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected within ten (10) days of receipt of the Courtesy Letter, a First Warning Letter is sent to the violator.
- 5. If the violation is repeated or uncorrected 10 days after the mailing of the First Warning, the matter is referred to those Summerlin South residents who serve on the



Compliance Committee.

- 6. The Compliance Committee will schedule a hearing and invite the violator to attend and present his/her response.
- 7. If the Compliance Committee is satisfied with the response, it may decide to drop the matter entirely.
- 8. If the Compliance Committee is not satisfied with the response, it may assess a monetary penalty as allowed pursuant to NRS 116.
- 9. If the violator is assessed a monetary penalty, the decision may be appealed to the Board of Directors, whose decision is final.

Summerlin[®] Celebrates National Trails Day Every Day!

While June 5 was the official American Hiking Society's National Trails Day, every day feels like trails day in Summerlin. That's because the community's expansive trail system that spans more than 150 miles is a signature amenity of the community and has consistently ranked as its most popular amenity in surveys of community residents.

The community's robust system of trails provides connectivity to major amenities like parks and schools, while encouraging a healthy, active lifestyle.

In the village of Stonebridge, the Summerlin Trail system will soon connect to the Red Rock area. As part of a larger planned Clark County Red Rock Canyon Legacy Trails project, the 5.5-mile section will start near Sky Vista Drive and link directly to the Red Rock Visitors Center. Construction on the new trail will begin this year with







completion targeted for 2022. The Howard Hughes Corporation is working closely with Clark County, the BLM, the Federal Highway Administration, and other groups to help design and implement the planned trail extension.

In 2008, the American Trails Association awarded The Howard Hughes Corporation, developer of Summerlin, with its American Trails Developer Award. The award recognizes developers who establish quality, well-designed, multi-use trails systems within private developments and is the only award of its kind in the nation. And in 2015, Summerlin received top national honors in the form of a gold award for Best Landscape Design from the National Association of Homebuilders.

The Summerlin Trail System is comprised of four kinds of trails. Landscaped and lighted street-side trails ideal for walking, jogging and strolling are the backbone of the system. Village trails are located in natural arroyos and man-made open spaces and are designed to provide respite from noise and traffic for long-distance runners and walkers.

Regional trails are part of the proposed valley-wide trail system for multiple, non-motorized uses. They provide a link to Bureau of Land Management land in Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area and are constructed as public/ private partnerships by Clark County and the city of Las Vegas in cooperation with The Howard Hughes Corporation.

And finally, natural trails exist within undeveloped areas of Summerlin and will eventually connect to more than 2,000 miles of planned regional trails throughout the valley. They are intended for use by outdoor and hiking enthusiasts. Hit the trail, Summerlin!

Auto Theft Is On The Rise Throughout The Valley "Protect Your Ride!"

O ur partners at the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration offer tips to act on to prevent vehicle theft. Don't be a part of this statistic: more than 770,000 drivers fall victim to vehicle theft each year. In fact, a vehicle is stolen about every 41 seconds in America. With July being Vehicle Theft Prevention Month, it's a good time to remind yourself of a few simple, yet important tips to prevent your car from being stolen.

Don't Make Your Vehicle a Target - Nearly half of vehicle theft is due to driver error, such as leaving your keys in the vehicle. **Always** take your keys with you, close your windows and lock the doors, and park in well-lit areas. **Never** leave valuables in your vehicle, especially where they can be seen, or leave the area while your vehicle is running.

Protect Your Vehicle - There are several different types of antitheft systems and devices designed to make vehicles more difficult to steal, or easier to trace and recover. **Audible and Visible Devices.** Alarms deter theft because they'll loudly bring attention to someone trying to get into your car. Steering wheel locks and theft-deterrent decals warn a would-be thief to stay away. *Immobilizing-Type Devices*. This antitheft system makes it nearly impossible for thieves to hot-wire your vehicle. *Vehicle Recovery Systems*. If your vehicle is stolen and has this system, law enforcement may be able to tap into this electronic transmission technology and locate your vehicle – and other stolen vehicles.

WHERE'S MY RIDE?

If your vehicle has been stolen, follow these steps: Contact police immediately to file a stolen-vehicle report. You'll need a copy of the police report and/or a case number to provide to your insurance company.

You may also be asked to provide the following information: License plate number, make, model, and color of your vehicle; and Vehicle identification number (VIN) and any identifying characteristics. Contact your insurance company to file a claim within 24 hours. If you find your vehicle before the authorities do, contact the police and your insurance company immediately.
