Getting Everyone On the Same Page

The search for a perfect floor plan was foremost on our minds, so when it happened to be in a community association, my wife and I never blinked an eye. After all, it was the Shangri La model. What could go wrong? Coupled with our understanding that associations essentially exist to help formalize common sense neighbor-to-neighbor considerations for each other, while also collectively sharing in expenses for local enhanced amenities, it all felt just right. A "Goldilocks" moment you might say.

A couple weeks into our settling in, I began noticing the apparent disillusionment of some fellow residents in the community. So I reached out to my new community manager to share concerns, hoping they could help me understand why: "There are a number of people that somehow think that it's legal and safe to allow their kids to drive golf carts and motorcycles in child-filled open spaces;" or "I often see adults walking their dogs with some shared belief that their dog's refuse somehow magically disappears;" or "I notice some residents decorate their backyards with 'quaint bistro lights' to make their house look like a cruise ship trying to catch the attention of a passing ship;" or "People find it hard to grasp why
