Goat Yoga



More Turf Reduction Efforts Underway

s our Las Vegas Valley continues to fight the headwinds of a relentless drought, please be aware that each of the community association service areas within Summerlin are doing their best to address ever-expanding turf and water restrictions focused on removal of existing turf areas deemed non-essential grass.

Your continued understanding and patience is appreciated as you see many of our common areas throughout Summerlin slowly transform from fescue grass to more drought-tolerant plantings and/or seasonal Bermuda grass which requires much less water than fescue to survive.

It is also important to note your respective association Boards, management teams and landscape subcontractors are working directly with

Las Vegas Valley Water District and Southern Nevada Water Authority representatives to judiciously identify these areas of turf reduction to assure continued enhancement of community common areas and usefulness of recreational open spaces in the most water efficient and practical manor possible.

This transformation effort will undoubtably take the next 12 to 18 months or more to unfold with many lessons to be learned along the way. With each area of renovation comes refurbishment of old irrigation systems and sensitive watering modifications specifically calibrated to help preserve mature trees and foliage.

I hope you and your family are having a safe and enjoyable spring. Stay well. GNMAWYA







Southern Nevada Water Authority

Summer Watering Schedule

With hot summer days around the corner, the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) is reminding the community that mandatory summer watering restrictions are in effect May 1 through August 31.

The summer restrictions prohibit spray irrigation between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. when water can be lost to intense heat and high winds. You can reduce the amount of water lost to evaporation by watering in the early morning or in the evening. As a reminder, Sunday watering is prohibited year-round.

By maintaining a three- or four-day watering schedule and slowly adding watering days as the summer heat increases, you can help reduce water use, save money on your water bills, and keep your landscape vibrant and healthy.

To prevent water waste, grass should be watered in three cycles of four minutes each set one hour apart, for a maximum of 12 minutes daily. That's all your grass needs. In addition, over-watering plants and shrubs with drip irrigation can do more harm than good, as most plants can



thrive when watered less often, such as on a two-or three -day per week summer schedule. Drip systems typically run for 30 to 90 minutes, depending on the flow rate of the emitters.

Watering during prohibited times or allowing water to spray or flow off your property is considered water waste and may result in a water-waste fee. Contact your water provider for complete details.

An easy way to get smart about landscape irrigation is by investing in a smart irrigation controller, which automatically adjusts your watering according to weather conditions. Many smart controllers can be accessed via apps on your mobile devices. To help defray the cost, the SNWA offers a rebate of 50 percent off the purchase price or up to \$100, whichever is less.



BARKING DOGS

ogs can be both an enjoyment and a nuisance, but dog barking is one of our most frequently received complaints. To remedy this situation, we recommend you first communicate with the pet owner in a friendly, nonthreatening way. If talking it out does not solve your problem, you may contact the City of Las Vegas Animal Control at 229-6444. They will respond by sending a representative out who will attempt to notify the owner that a complaint has been registered and try to substantiate the complaint. If the owner is not at home, the representative will post a notice. After the third (3rd) complaint is received by Animal Control, the complaining party is requested to fill out and sign a verification form. At that time another neighbor/witness will be sought to substantiate the problem. If Animal Control receives sufficient information from the verification forms the information is then forwarded to the city attorney for action.

After you have notified Animal Control, contact your Summerlin Community Service Representative through summerlink.com. The Association will send the owner a letter about the issue. (Please be reminded that all complaints must be in writing). If the problem continues, the Compliance Process as outlined in previous publications is followed. This could include a hearing and a fine if the Association is able to verify the barking from at least two neighbors.

Hopefully, pet owners are becoming more aware that while doggy doors are convenient for themselves and their pets, they can create problems for their neighbors. As a courtesy to the neighbors, pet owners should not allow their pets free door access when they are not at

Regardless of how well behaved a dog is, it is a City Ordinance that no person owning or having possession of any animal shall cause, permit or allow the animal to stray, run or in any manner be at large. Animals must be restrained at all times so that said animal cannot leave or escape from the premises upon which it resides. Please contact Animal Control when you see dogs unrestrained, then notify your Summerlin Community Service Representative.

Working and communicating together as neighbors in a friendly manner will go a long way in controlling this issue. 🌼

Red Rock Legacy Trail Construction To Start Next Year; Trail To Connect Summerlin® Directly To Red Rock Canyon

Summerlin's signature trail system will soon connect cyclists and hikers to Red Rock Canyon from the village of Stonebridge, thanks to a planned 20-mile, \$100-million bike and hiking trail that will run alongside Nevada State Route 159.

As part of the larger planned Clark County Red Rock Canyon Legacy Trails project, the 5.5-mile, nearly \$15-mllion section is the first phase and it begins in Summerlin near Sky Vista Drive, linking directly to the Red Rock Visitors Center. The Howard Hughes Corporation is working closely with Clark County, the BLM, the Federal Highway Administration, and other groups to help design and implement the planned trail extension.

The first phase is funded through a grant from the Federal Lands Access program and Clark County. Subsequent phases will be funded by Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act Funds.

"Summerlin's signature trail system has consistently been ranked by residents as the community's most popular amenity," said Julie Cleaver, SVP, Planning and Design for Summerlin. "With more than 200 miles of trailways of all types in Summerlin, it's no wonder they are so beloved. Whether you're a cyclist, a mom with a stroller, a runner, or just someone who loves to be out-doors, the Summerlin trail system is the place to be. We are excited for this new extension that will connect residents directly into Red Rock Canyon."

In 2008, the American Trails Association awarded The Howard Hughes Corporation, developer of Summerlin, with its American Trails Developer Award. The award recognizes developers who establish quality, well-designed, multi-use trails systems within private developments and is the only award of its kind in the nation.

The Summerlin Trail System is comprised of four kinds of trails. Landscaped and lighted street-side trails ideal for walking, jogging and strolling, are the backbone of the system. Village trails are located in natural arroyos and man-made open spaces and are designed to provide respite from noise and traffic for long-distance runners and walkers.



The Summerlin Trail System is more than 200 miles in length and varies in style as it meanders through the community.

Regional trails are part of the proposed valley-wide trail system for multiple, non-motorized uses. They provide a link to Bureau of Land Management land in Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area and are constructed as public/private partnerships by Clark County and the city of Las Vegas in cooperation with The Howard Hughes Corporation.

And finally, Summerlin will eventually be home to natural earthen-tread trails within undeveloped areas of the community. They are intended for use by outdoor and hiking enthusiasts.


