All donations will go through a Department of Defense Certified data wipe and qualify for a tax deduction.

When possible, items donated will be refurbished by members of The Blind Center of Nevada which provides jobs and assists those who are blind or visually impaired in reaching their highest potential. Items that are not able to be refurbished will be taken apart and safely recycled to conserve natural resources and avoid air and water pollution.



Winter Landscape Watering Tips and Guidelines

With the New Year approaching, it is crucial for the community to follow the mandatory winter watering schedule, in effect through February 28, which limits landscape irrigation to one assigned day a week. Find your watering day at snwa.com

A federal water shortage declaration on the Colorado River, which will reduce the amount of water we can withdraw from Lake Mead by more than 8 billion gallons will take effect in 2023. Reducing your outdoor water use by simply changing your watering clock each season is now more crucial than ever and it's the law.

In addition to adhering to the seasonal watering schedule, the Southern

Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) has other helpful tips you can follow to save water and money this holiday season:

Drip Watering - Water your dripirrigated plants and trees every seven to 14 days, but for a longer duration, depending on the flow of your emitters.

Sprinkler Watering - Water grass for a recommended maximum of 12 minutes on your designated watering day, in three, 4-minute cycles spaced an hour apart.

Midmorning Watering - Watering landscapes during the midmorning hours reduces the chance of icing to occur.

Rainy Days - Take advantage of



nature's generosity and turn off irrigation systems during rainy weather, to avoid overwatering of landscapes and potential water waste, and on windy days to avoid overspray.

While temperatures may be cooler and the days shorter in winter, conserving water isn't less important than in spring or summer. By following the seasonal watering restrictions and preventing and reporting water waste, the community can save millions of gallons of water, which can help offset the upcoming federal water reductions from Lake Mead.

2022 Year in Review For Summerlin®

Summerlin® continued its remarkable, decades-long trajectory in 2022, capping off a year of milestone development in Downtown Summerlin®, the community's dynamic urban core with annual visitation exceeding 20 million – more than Disneyland!


Within the community's residential sector, 2022 saw the opening of nine new neighborhoods offering dozens of new floorplans. Combined with 14 existing neighborhoods, Summerlin has expanded its home offerings to the widest range of styles and prices in the Valley.

While 2022 national rankings for home sales in masterplanned communities (MPCs) are not yet finalized, Summerlin is expected to once again retain a top position as one of the country's best-selling MPCs. The community's home sales were fueled by the opening of nine new neighborhoods during 2022, all of which are located in Summerlin West in the emerging districts of Redpoint, Redpoint Square, Kestrel and Kestrel Commons.

At Downtown Summerlin, construction was completed on 1700 Pavilion, a ten-story Class-A office building that is 51 percent pre-leased, with 40 percent under letters of intent or negotiation and tenant improvements for several suites underway with occupancy expected to begin shortly. A February 2023 grand opening is planned for the building that features spectacular valley and mountain views and a colorful mural that wraps its garage, designed by Summerlin resident and celebrated local artist Bonnie Kelso.

During 2022, construction continued on Tanager Echo, the second phase of Downtown Summerlin's Tanager luxury apartments, offering nearly 300 units and a variety of onsite amenities. Completion is planned for Q1 2023 to meet growing demand for high-end, urban-style living surrounded by the vibrancy of Downtown Summerlin's urban core.

Downtown Summerlin's retail offerings grew during 2022 by the addition of six new brands, including The Raider Image, Altar d'State/Arula, Kendra Scott, Daiso Japan, The Bagel Nook, and IS Luxury. Helping to drive Downtown Summerlin's annual visitation numbers to record highs during 2022 were major events, including the Summerlin Festival of Arts and the destination's popular seasonal parades: Lunar New Year; Halloween Parade of Mischief; Holiday; and new to the line-up in 2022, Lei Day

Parade, marking Asian Pacific American Heritage Month.

In September, The Howard Hughes Corporation® (HHC) broke ground on a new Class-A office complex in Summerlin South near the 215 Beltway and in the popular southwest sub-market. The Project includes two threestory buildings, each spanning 73,500 square feet and connected by a first-floor lobby. It is slated for completion by year-end 2023.

Major new community amenities completed in 2022 include Clark County Fire Station 35 near the 215 Beltway and Town Center Drive, for which HHC funded its design, development and construction, representing an investment in public safety infrastructure of more than \$10 million. Currently under active development and planning are several parks and open space areas located in the developing areas of Summerlin West that will have staggered opening dates starting in late 2023.

And finally, HHC continued to work closely with Summerlin Master Associations and the Summerlin Council to support the ongoing effort to remove non-essential grass areas throughout the community consistent with valleywide water conservation initiatives. In total, more than six acres of grass were removed in 2022, saving more than 16 million gallons of water annually.



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
