

## New Excess Water Use Charge Now In Effect

With federal water shortages on the Colorado River continuing to impact how much water Southern Nevada can withdraw from Lake Mead, the Las Vegas Valley Water District (LVVWD) has enacted an excess use charge aimed at reducing unnecessarily high-water use for residential customers.

The excessive use charge went into effect January 1, and is applied when water use exceeds established monthly thresholds that change seasonally (see chart above). The excessive use charge is \$9 per 1,000 gallons of water use above the seasonal thresholds. More information, including a water bill estimator, visit **lvvwd.com**.

Follow these simple tips to help manage your water bill:

• Follow the mandatory seasonal watering restrictions and save up to \$300 annually on your water bill. Summer restrictions are in effect May 1 through August 31 and prohibit spray irrigation between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Sunday watering is prohibited all year.

#### SEASON MONTHLY THRESHOLD

| Winter (November 1-February 28) | 14,000 gallons |
|---------------------------------|----------------|
| Spring (March 1-April 30)       | 16,000 gallons |
| Summer (May 1-August 31)        | 28,000 gallons |
| Fall (September 1-October 31)   | 26,000 gallons |

- Upgrade your water-thirsty grass to a beautiful, vibrant water smart landscape and get \$3 per square foot from Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA). This can reduce your outdoor water use by up to 75 percent.
- Fix leaks and broken sprinklers or drip systems.

While you may be tempted to increase your landscape watering as temperatures start getting hotter, grass can survive with less water during this time of year. In May, while nights are still cool, gradually increase your sprinklers from three days to four. From there, keep an eye on your landscape and increase watering only as needed into June, July and August. On the other hand, plants and trees on drip irrigation can thrive with much less water. In the summer, water them two to three days a week.

Continuing to follow the seasonal watering schedules and restrictions will help you avoid excessive usage charges while saving money on your monthly bills. For more information, visit **snwa.com**.

### **BARKING DOGS**

Dogs can be both an enjoyment and a nuisance, but dog barking is one of our most frequently received complaints. To remedy this situation, we recommend you first communicate with the pet owner in a friendly, nonthreatening way. If talking it out does not solve your problem, you may contact the City of Las Vegas Animal Control at 229-6444. They will respond by sending a representative out who will attempt to notify the owner that a complaint has been registered and try to substantiate the complaint. If the owner is not at home, the representative will post a notice. After the third  $(3^{rd})$  complaint is received by Animal Control, the complaining party is requested to fill out and sign a verification form. At that time another neighbor/witness will be sought to substantiate the problem. If Animal Control receives sufficient information from the verification forms the information is then forwarded to the city attorney for action.

After you have notified Animal Control, contact your Summerlin Community Service Representative through




**summerlink.com**. The Association will send the owner a letter about the issue. (Please be reminded that all complaints must be in writing). If the problem continues, the Compliance Process as outlined in previous publications is followed. This could include a hearing and a fine if the Association is able to verify the barking from at least two neighbors.

Hopefully, pet owners are becoming more aware that while doggy doors are convenient for themselves and their pets, they can create problems for their neighbors. As a courtesy to the neighbors, pet owners should not allow their pets free door access when they are not at home.

Regardless of how well behaved a dog is, it is a City Ordinance that no person owning or having possession of any animal shall cause, permit or allow the animal to stray, run or in any manner be at large. Animals must be restrained at all times so that said animal cannot leave or escape from the premises upon which it resides. Please contact Animal Control when you see dogs unrestrained, then notify your Summerlin Community Service Representative.

Working and communicating together as neighbors in a friendly manner will go a long way in controlling this issue.

# Summerlin<sup>®</sup> Trail System Continues to Evolve with the Community

For Summerlin<sup>®</sup> residents, it comes as no surprise that trails consistently rank in community surveys as Summerlin's most popular amenity. With more than 250 miles of trailways of all types, the Summerlin Trail System was carefully planned from the community's inception to connect neighborhoods and residents with parks, shopping centers and schools, providing miles of uninterrupted scenery for walkers, strollers, and runners to promote a healthy, active lifestyle. In Summerlin West, multi-modal trails will be installed over the next few years to encourage residents to explore diverse transportation options for their daily commutes.

According to Julie Cleaver, Senior Vice President, Commercial and Residential Planning for Summerlin, walkability and connectivity have long been pillars of Summerlin's community planning and design philosophy. "The Summerlin Trail system includes a variety of trail types that reflect the character of the village, topography, and natural setting of their location," said Cleaver. "For example, our trails in Summerlin West tend to be populated with more native or enhanced native vegetation consistent with the surroundings, taking on the look and feel of the rich desert environment."

Multimodal planning is evident even throughout Downtown Summerlin where walkability is an important element of this dynamic, outdoor destination. For those who work in Downtown Summerlin's office buildings, walking to lunch, shopping or errand running is a huge benefit that creates a better work/life balance.

The Summerlin Trail System, which is second-to-none in the valley, is comprised of four kinds of trails. Landscaped and lighted street-side trails ideal for walking, jogging and strolling, are the backbone of the system. Village trails are located in natural arroyos and man-made open spaces and are designed to provide respite from noise and traffic for long-distance runners and walkers.

Regional trails are part of the proposed valley-wide trail system for multiple, non-motorized uses. They provide a link to Bureau of Land Management land in Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area and are constructed as public/private partnerships by Clark County and the City of Las Vegas in cooperation with The Howard Hughes



Summerlin's popular trail system continues to evolve. In Summerlin West, multi-model trails will be installed over the next few years to encourage residents to explore diverse transportation options for their daily commutes.

Corporation. And finally, Summerlin will eventually be home to natural earthen-tread trails within undeveloped areas of the community. They are intended for use by outdoor and hiking enthusiasts.

Summerlin's signature trail system will eventually connect cyclists and hikers to Red Rock Canyon area from the village of Stonebridge thanks to a planned 20-mile bike and hiking trail that will run alongside Nevada State Route 159. As part of the larger planned Clark County Red Rock Canyon Legacy Trails project, the 5.5-mile section is the first phase and will begin in Summerlin near Sky Vista Drive, linking directly to the Red Rock Visitors Center. The Howard Hughes Corporation is working closely with Clark County, the BLM, the Federal Highway Administration, and other groups to help design and implement the planned trail extension.


