

More Eyes and Ears Are Always Welcome

s you are aware, your Summerlin Council primarily exists to own, maintain, activate and watch over the 470+ acres of community parks, amenities and general open spaces throughout Summerlin. Trust me when I share that the proper care and oversight of these widely used community open spaces and amenities is in essence a daily "labor of love" continually engaging dedicated layers of personnel and assigned role players. Yet, take a moment to imagine a party in your own backyard every day. Such is the challenge we task of our Summerlin Council park patrol.

As you share in the use and enjoyment of our community park amenities with your fellow neighbors, it might

be helpful to familiarize yourself with the varied responsibilities of our Summerlin Council park patrol. And please remember it can sometimes be a tough and thankless job having to occasionally remind children and adults alike to respect the rules and/or to lighten up a little.

First and foremost, it helps to note that our park patrol/monitors are unarmed and equipped with radios/ phones and report forms. Quite simply, their charge is to observe and report, while also lending a hand to help each park function in a more orderly manner. If they witness a rule's violation they will point out what the community rule is and request that

the individual obey such rule. Much like all Summerlin community guidelines, there is a heavy reliance on all of us as residents "to do the right thing".

In the case of a law being broken, such as City/County pet leash laws, unlawful beverages in parks, vandalism/ property damage issues, the occasional presence of homelessness, and other concerns, the park patrol will often seek Metro police assistance. As you might imagine, with the addition of a dedicated Metro Summerlin Area Command, our expanding community partnership with Metro officers and leadership serves as a valuable resource.

Should you witness any unlawful behavior we encourage you to call Metro as well. On rare, but sometimes necessary occasions our guards will go so far as to have uncooperative individuals "trespassed" out of the park. The park guards are in regular communication with their supervisors and provide copies of their daily paperwork to community management staff for proper follow-up.

It is important to note the primary responsibility of the park patrol is to watch over Council parks and open spaces. This would include such areas as the Trails, Willows, Gardens, and Vistas Community Centers, the Willows, Trails, and Vistas Pools, the Arbors Tennis Facility, and all the many other Council owned parks and facilities throughout Summerlin. While making their rounds, the park

patrol will lock up restrooms and parking lot entries late each evening and then re-open the facilities early each morning. Guards are also directed to help monitor sport field lighting usage to assure that lights are turned on and off in a timely and efficient manner.

In addition, park patrol supervisors are routinely roving from park to park in support of their staff and have therefore been asked to also keep a watchful eye on the main boulevards and streets within Summerlin to identify and report any major problems or concerns relating to general common area property. Please do not mistake the Summerlin Council Park Patrol Service as private security. The patrol has no relationship to your home or private property.

History has shown that the presence of our park patrol guards and roving supervisors throughout Summerlin has been instrumental in quickly identifying safety and property damage issues while also serving to act as an important deterrent to mischief, vandalism, and crime in the community's parks and open spaces. Historically, residents and park users have also served as helpful eyes and ears. To that end, should you have a park thought or concern you wish to share, please don't hesitate to communicate it to Summerlin Council. Thank you for following our community park rules, it makes the use of our Summerlin amenities more enjoyable for all. GNMAWYA 💙



Preparing for Summer with Smart Irrigation

With summer approaching, it's time to adjust your landscape irrigation clock to follow the community's mandatory seasonal watering schedule.

In effect May 1 through August 31, the summer schedule prohibits spray irrigation between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Sunday watering is prohibited. However, just because you can water more this summer doesn't mean you need to. Follow these tips to help you maintain a healthy landscape and manage your water bill.

- Water in the early morning to minimize the amount of water lost to evaporation and daytime winds.
- Water grass on a three- or four-day a week schedule and slowly add additional days as the summer heat increases.
- Water your grass no more than 12 minutes total per watering day. It's all your grass needs. Run sprinklers 3 times a day for 4 minutes each cycle, spaced 1 hour apart.
- Plants and trees require much less water than grass. Set your drip irrigation to two to three days a week.




The average customer can save up to \$300 annually on their water bills by following the seasonal watering restrictions year-round.

Take advantage of the cash rebate the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) offers on the purchase of smart irrigation controllers, which use sensors and weather data to automatically adjust irrigation system run times and the amount of water your landscape needs.

The SNWA's rebate offers 50 percent off the purchase price of a new smart controller, or up to \$100, whichever is less. Installing a smart controller can not only help you maintain a healthy landscape through the heat of summer, but it also can help you cut your outdoor water use by as much as 30 percent, which also will save money on your monthly water bill.



ARE YOU PLANNING TO REPAINT YOUR HOME?

How do I submit to repaint the exterior of my home? In answering this common question, please note that there is no pre-approved paint scheme for any residential properties in Summerlin West. All requests to alter the exterior color scheme of individual properties are reviewed on a case-by-case basis with consideration being given to the architectural style of the residence, the color of existing roof tile and/or stone veneer on the residence, the number of contrasting colors originally on the home, the color palette of the surrounding neighborhood, etc. The use of original paint colors in the original locations is considered routine maintenance and does not require approval.

The specific procedures and information for submitting your painting request are described in Article V., Section B. of the Association's Design Guidelines and Standards. When submitting you must provide the following:

- A completed Improvement Request form. (a copy of this form is located on Summerlink.com/ Homeowners Summerlin West/Design Review/ Improvement Request Form)
- A blocking plan/elevation drawing detailing which colors will be used on the exterior surfaces of the home.
- An accurate set of paint chips showing the name and manufacturer's code for each of the proposed colors.
- Confirm the paint colors selected is not the same color scheme as your neighbors to the immediate right, left and directly across the street from your residence.
- In an effort to ensure the review process is effectively administered and that individual property owners are treated equitably we review submittals only in the order they are received.




