A Good Time Was Meant To Be Had By All

As we wind down another extremely hot, but active summer and seam-lessly shift gears into cooler fall play days, it feels timely to remind everyone of a mainstay community standard of our Summerlin Council Park etiquette.

If you are a frequent visitor to our park open spaces, you are keenly aware that Summerlin Council parks have occasionally experienced individuals or organizations inviting extremely large groups of people to a park for "their" special activity. While the Summerlin Council certainly understands and appreciates the community spirit and intent in which these large gatherings or events were conceived, the reality

is that such activities can quickly overwhelm certain parks and make it very difficult, if not impossible, for other residents to also enjoy the community amenity. Quite simply, each of our Summerlin parks has its own design characteristics and proper capacity limitations and therefore not all parks are well-suited for handling especially large crowds or special events.

Experience has shown us that these inappropriate sized gatherings in smaller venues often lead to unsafe traffic patterns, unsafe parking and pedestrian conditions, highly inadequate levels of restroom facilities for all visitors, extreme trash and noise issues and



To help avoid this particular outcome and the various challenges it can bring, please be reminded that the Summerlin Council has developed and adopted a park use permit program. Any group of more than 100 people is required to apply for and secure a Park Use Permit from Summerlin Council in order to stage their activity in a Summerlin park. We have found that this approach allows our park staff to better assist residents and organizations by helping them to align their large group with the appropriate size park for their specific gathering. I should also note that due to constant demand, not all large group activities can or will be accommodated. Our goal remains making things a little better every day for our residents and, as always, your continued understanding and cooperation is greatly appreciated. 

SUMMERLIN WEST COMPLIANCE **PROCEDURES**

There are predominately two documents that define the Community Wide Standards for Summerlin West. These are the Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Reservation of Easement, which contains the use restrictions, and the Design Guidelines and Standards that provide guidance to homeowners wishing to make improvements and modifications to the exterior of their homes or their landscaping. These documents are provided to each purchaser at the time they close escrow on their homes. In addition, these documents can be found at summerlink.com. Click on the Residents icon on the top and then the West Association icon.

In order to provide the due process required under Nevada law, if a violation of the Summerlin West Governing Documents is suspected, the steps available to the association to achieve resolution are:

• Friendly neighbor-to-neighbor contact which often will resolve the matter quickly and easily. If contact is unproductive, deemed to be unwise, or inappropriate, then:

- Violations must be reported in writing. A "Complaint Form" can be obtained at the Summerlin Community Association office at 2115 Festival Plaza Drive, Suite 220, and on the www.summerlink.com_website. Click on Residents icon, go the West Association and then to Homeowner Complaint Form.
- If the violation is verified, a Courtesy Letter will be sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected within ten (10) days of receipt of the Courtesy Letter, a First Warning Letter is sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected 10 days after the mailing of the First Warning, the matter is referred to those Summerlin West residents who serve on the Compliance Advisory Committee.
- The Compliance Advisory Committee will schedule a hearing and invite the violator to attend and present his/her response.
- If the Compliance Advisory Committee is satisfied with the response, it may decide to drop the matter entirely.
- If the Compliance Advisory Committee is not satisfied with the response, it may assess a monetary penalty as allowed pursuant to NRS 116.31031.
- If the violator is assessed a monetary penalty, the decision may be appealed to the Board of Directors, whose decision is final.

Fall Is A Cool Time To Save Water in Southern Nevada

Water in Southern Nevada

Fall in Southern Nevada means football, hot pumpkin to

F spice drinks, and a welcome break from the intense heat of summer. The cool days and nights of fall also provide a great opportunity for residents to focus on conserving the community's most precious resource.

For starters, residents must change their landscape irrigation clock to follow the mandatory seasonal watering restrictions, in effect September 1 through October 31. The mandatory fall restrictions limit landscape irrigation to three assigned watering days per week; Sunday watering is prohibited.

In fall, most landscapes on drip irrigation systems thrive on one to two days of watering per week. Run drip irrigation systems for a recommended 30 to 60 minutes once or twice a week and adjust as needed. Grass should be watered no more than 12 minutes total per watering day, which can be spaced into three 4-minute cycles set one hour apart



to avoid run-off. For more watering tips and to find your assigned watering days, visit **snwa.com**.

Meanwhile, fall also is an ideal time to upgrade your grass landscape to water-efficient, drip-irrigated plants and trees through the Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) Water Smart Landscape Rebate program (WSL). Whether you do the work yourself or hire a water-smart contractor, you can earn a cash incentive of up to \$3 per square foot of grass you replace with desert-adapted landscaping and \$100 for every new tree planted in your water-efficient yard (restrictions apply). The SNWA recommends such species as Weeping Acacia, Foothill Palo Verde, and Western Honey Mesquite. A comprehensive list of recommended trees is available at snwa.com.


