2024 Projected **Budget Forecasts**

For the past several weeks your respective community pective community management teams, finance committees, and boards have been working on 2024 operating budgets. Here is a quick glimpse of how next year appears to be shaping up.

Summerlin North – The North currently projects 2024 revenues and expenses of \$14,140,811. This would be accomplished by increasing the present monthly assessment rate to \$65 per unit starting January 1, 2024.

Summerlin South – The South is projecting 2024 revenues and expenses of \$11,538,019. This would be accomplished by increasing the present monthly assessment rate to \$65 per unit starting January 1, 2024.

Summerlin West - The West anticipates revenues and expenses of \$9,999,840 in 2024. This would be accomplished by increasing the present monthly assessment rate to \$60 per unit starting January 1, 2024.

Summerlin Council - The Council anticipates spending \$17,066,158 next year for community park and recreation operations. To accomplish this, the Council's projected monthly share of your master association assessment will increase \$2 to \$28 per unit. It is important to note the \$28 per month allocation is included in your respective monthly association assessments.

As a reminder, Council dollars focus on community center and pool

operations, programming, special events and activities, maintenance and preservation of general park conditions, and any necessary park renovations or repairs.

This year's Council increase is primarily due to added personnel, growing labor and utility costs, targeted special turf projects and building up their reserves. The North, South, and West master associations would also be increasing their assessments primarily in response to increased labor and utility costs, additional funds for the Council's contribution, and ongoing costs for mandated turf reduction projects. In addition, the South's increase will also help to address building costs related to construction of their permanent administrative office to be located at the south end of Community Park.

Please note that more specific budget information is mailed to each of you by your respective associations as part of your annual budget ratification process.

My thanks to the many individuals that volunteered their time to work on next year's numbers. It is my sense that each of these budgets achieves the overall goal of preserving the operations and appearance of our Summerlin community in the most value-conscious way possible. GNMAWYA



Leak Detection Critical For Saving Water

In recent years, the Las Vegas Valley Water District has enhanced its efforts to ensure the efficient and uninterrupted flow of water through the community's complex underground grid of pipes and valves. While the nature of this work may appear complicated, the LVVWD deploys various high-tech tools to detect and repair leaks in a timely manner to avoid major shutdowns and loss of service.


One of these tools is an acoustic monitoring system, which "listens" to water as it flows through pipes and alerts technicians in the event of a leak. Typically, water flowing through pipes generates a low-frequency sound; however, the system can detect a high-frequency sound wave if water is leaking from a pipe. LVVWD technicians can then trace the leak's location and work quickly to repair it.


• To help residents detect, locate, and repair leaks, the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) offers a rebate for smart leak detectors of 50 percent off the purchase price or \$200, whichever is less.



- To receive the smart leak detector rebate coupon, applicants must participate in a 60-month research study related to consumer leak detection devices.
- The program allows for one coupon per address.
- Coupons are redeemable only for the purchase of a qualifying product.
- The date of purchase from customer receipt must be within 30 days of the coupon's printed date.

The smart leak detector rebate program is important to the community as the leak detectors can help provide alerts to residents of potential water waste. This can help prevent you from incurring an excessive usage charge as the thresholds for seasonal water use were reduced earlier this year. For more information, visit snwa.com.


