



LANDSCAPING REQUIREMENTS SUMMERLIN WEST


Tave you recently moved to Summerlin West? Are you ■planning on making any modifications to your home? Please note some helpful reminders of requirements under our governing documents prior to making any changes.

Section 1.15 of the Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Reservation of Easements reads in part as follows: "Rear yards shall be substantially complete within one (1) year following the date of conveyance of the Lot from the Participating Builder to the first owner other than a Participating Builder". This means that if you purchased your home directly from the builder you have one (1) year from the date of the close of escrow to have your rear yard substantially completed. If you are a second or subsequent owner of your home, you have one (1) year from the date the first owner_closed escrow from the builder (see previous sentence). The Association will approve two (2) inches of decorative landscape rock covering all areas of bare dirt as "substantial completion" of a rear yard.

Section 1.12 of this same document continues as follows: "There shall be no excavation, construction, alteration or erection of any Improvement (including any projection) which in any way alters the exterior appearance of any existing Improvement or any portion of a Lot without the prior approval of the Design Review Committee".

Plans must be submitted to the Design Review Committee for any modification being made to the exterior of your home, prior to any work being performed.

The requirement for submittal also extends to rear yard landscaping whether it is to be homeowner or builder installed. So, if you are approaching your one-year time requirement for rear yard landscaping, please be reminded that your rear yard landscape plans also must be submitted to the Committee for review prior to installation. If you installed your rear yard landscaping without first obtaining approval from the Design Review Committee, you should submit those plans as soon as possible for consideration. The Improvement Request Form is available at 2115 Festival Plaza Drive, Suite 220, Las Vegas, NV 89135 or at www.summerlink.com. The Design Guidelines and Standards are also available online. Please be reminded that the governing documents provide for a 30-day review process starting on the date that a complete submittal (all required information needed for the review) is received by the Association.

SNWA Offers Largest Cash-For-Grass Incentive Yet

Spring into action this season by trading your grass for cash with the Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) biggest incentive ever. SNWA has temporarily increased the Water Smart Landscape Rebate (WSLR) for homeowners from \$3 to \$5 per square foot of grass upgraded to water-efficient landscaping for the rest of 2024.

Qualifying homeowners will receive \$5 for each square foot of grass they convert (up to the first 10,000 square feet) to drip-irrigated, desert-adapted plants and trees, and \$3.50 for each additional square foot. Conversions must be completed by the end of 2024 to receive the increased incentive.

Businesses, municipalities, community associations, and multi-family properties remain eligible for the current \$3 per square foot incentive, which will decrease to \$2 per square foot for nonfunctional, decorative grass beginning in 2025.

Outdoor landscaping is the biggest user of Southern Nevada's limited water supply. By converting to a Water



Smart landscape, you'll use 55 gallons of water less per square foot than thirsty-grass landscapes.

While it can seem daunting to consider removing your home's grass, embracing a lawn-free landscape not only conserves water but also reduces maintenance efforts, allowing for a more sustainable and vibrant outdoor space.

It's also time to change your watering clock. Seasonal watering restrictions in effect March 1 through April 30, and limits landscape watering to up to three assigned days per week (Sunday watering is prohibited all year). Plants and trees on drip systems, require less water, only needing to be watered every one to two days. Spring is a great time to up-grade your grass to a beautiful water-efficient landscape! 
