SUMMERLIN WEST COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES

There are predominately two documents that define the Community Wide Standards for Summerlin West. These are the Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Reservation of Easement, which contains the use restrictions, and the Design Guidelines and Standards that provide guidance to homeowners wishing to make improvements and modifications to the exterior of their homes or their landscaping. These documents are provided to each purchaser at the time they close escrow on their homes. In addition, these documents can be found at www.summerlink.com. Click on the Residents icon on the top and then the West Association icon.

In order to provide the due process required under Nevada law, if a violation of the Summerlin West Governing Documents is suspected, the steps available to the association to achieve resolution are:

- Friendly neighbor-to-neighbor contact which often will resolve the matter quickly and easily. If such

contact is unproductive, deemed to be unwise, or inappropriate, then:

- Violations must be reported in writing. A “Complaint Form” can be obtained at the Summerlin Community Association office at 2115 Festival Plaza Drive, Suite 220, and on the summerlink.com website. Click on Residents icon, go the West Association and then to Homeowner Complaint Form.
- If the violation is verified, a Courtesy Letter will be sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected within ten (10) days of receipt of the Courtesy Letter, a First Warning Letter is sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected 10 days after the mailing of the First Warning, the matter is referred to those Summerlin West residents who serve on the Compliance Advisory Committee.
- The Compliance Advisory Committee will schedule a hearing and invite the violator to attend and present his/her response.
- If the Compliance Advisory Committee is satisfied with the response, it may decide to drop the matter entirely.
- If the Compliance Advisory Committee is not satisfied with the response, it may assess a monetary penalty as allowed pursuant to NRS 116.31031.
- If the violator is assessed a monetary penalty, the decision may be appealed to the Board of Directors, whose decision is final.



RESIDENT ID CARDS

COMMUNITY DEVELOPER UPDATE

New Urban Trail Design Enhancing Multi-Modal Transportation In Summerlin®

As the first community in Southern Nevada to incorporate roundabouts into its street plan, Summerlin® recognized the circular junction’s proven safety, environmental, and traffic flow benefits. By design, roundabouts are known to reduce the number of auto collisions like those that occur at traditional intersections. They improve traffic flow by keeping it moving without the stops and starts of intersections, and they eliminate idling at intersections which reduces automobile emissions.

Today, Summerlin land planners are incorporating another novel approach to transportation via an urban trail design to expand access for cyclists and pedestrians connecting them to a future planned urban center in Summerlin West. An emerging trend nationwide, ‘complete street’ design accommodates multi-modal transportation in a more integrated and safer manner.

According to Julie Cleaver, Senior Vice President, Commercial and Residential Planning for Summerlin, the urban trail was developed from several focus groups conducted with mountain bikers, serious cyclists, and casual riders.

“To ensure we created an inclusive experience along the roadway for all cyclists regardless of their level, we enlisted their various inputs to really make this a community effort,” said Cleaver. “Our design was guided by sensitivity to the potential conflict between casual riders, cars, and pedestrians. By incorporating a complete street design approach, we are able to safely accommodate all users.”

“For more efficient circulation in the planned commercial area west of the Summerlin Parkway interchange with the I-215 bypass, we have designed a dedicated bike lane that’s part of the streetscape,” Cleaver continued. “This allows the

bike lane to be separated from motor vehicles and creates a safer experience for the cyclists. The urban trail will be located in the heart of the urban core and connects to other bike trails that lead the surrounding neighborhoods.”

Cleaver explained that this new design also includes a generous landscape strip to provide shade and separation between cyclists and pedestrians and enhanced street lighting and signage to ensure everyone is aware of the directional flow. ☀️

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WATER CONSERVATION

Southern Nevada Water Authority

Summer watering restrictions now in effect through August

As summer approaches, the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) is reminding residents and businesses to continue their support in conserving our region's precious water resources by following the community's mandatory summer watering restrictions, in effect May 1 through August 31.

- The summer restrictions prohibit spray irrigation between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. when water can be lost to intense heat and high winds.
- Watering in the early morning or evening reduces the amount of water lost to evaporation.
- Watering during prohibited hours or allowing water to spray or flow off your property is considered water waste and may result in a costly fine.
- Irrigate grass with pop-up sprinklers for a maximum of 12 minutes per watering day, set in three four minute cycles, spaced one hour apart. That's all your grass needs.



- And remember, Sunday watering is prohibited year-round. Over-watering plants and trees with drip irrigation can do more harm than good, as most plants and trees can thrive when watered less often, such as on a two or three-day per week summer schedule. These water-efficient plants have distinct needs compared to grass and can thrive on less water even in hotter conditions. Drip systems typically run for 30 to 90 minutes, depending on the flow rate of the emitters. By following seasonal watering restrictions year-round, you can save up to \$300 annually on your water bills.
