A Plea For Safety: E-Bike & E-Motorcycles In Our Community

You may be wondering, what are the general differences between an electric bike (e-bike) and an electric motorcycle (e-motorcycle). The Las Vegas Metro Police Department provides guidance to distinguish between the two. An e-bike is a device that has fully operable pedals, has an electric motor that produces less than 750 watts, and has a seat or saddle for the rider. An e-motorcycle is any device that exceeds 750 watts, must be registered, insured, and riders must wear a helmet.

As you are aware, the popularity of these devices has soared. They offer an exciting, eco-friendly mode of transportation and recreation for adults, teenagers, and children. However, as their numbers increase, so do the

risks both for our safety and for the integrity of our community shared spaces. As parents and community members, it is our responsibility to ensure that this new wave of technology is enjoyed safely and responsibly.

For young riders, these devices represent newfound freedom and a taste of modern mobility. Yet, with these benefits come challenges. The power and speed of these devices demand respect and proper handling. Inexperienced riders may not fully appreciate the hazards of high-speed travel, especially within community parks and certain open space environments not originally intended for rapid motorized movement.

In addition to safety concerns, it comes as no surprise that The Sum-

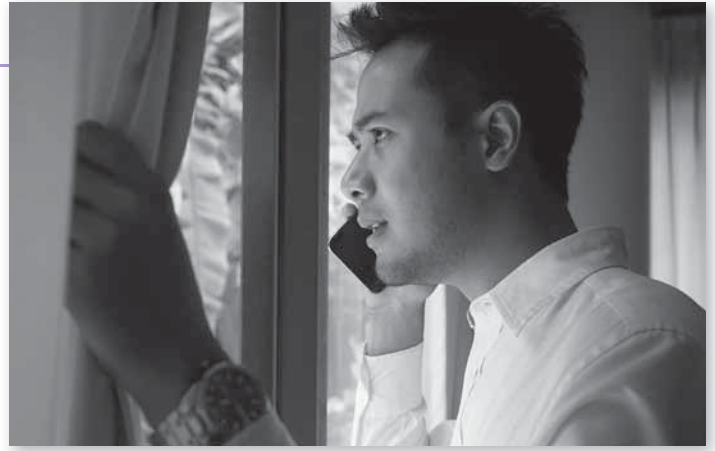

The Why and How to Report Crime

If a tree falls in the woods and no one is there to hear it, does it make a sound? Often residents see a crime or other suspicious activity or are the victim of a minor crime and do not take time to properly report it. This can lead to LVMPD not being aware of a problem in our community. If it is not reported, our patrol officers cannot respond as it is occurring. This also prevents detectives from investigating crimes after they occur.

In today's digital world, many post online – to social media or chat groups. By doing so, they may believe they are spreading awareness. Without reporting it to proper authorities, this could lead to gossip, misinformation, panic or fear of crime in our community.

LVMPD asks our community to partner with us to reduce crime and keep communities safe. The best way to do this is to be a “good witness.” If you see suspicious activity or a crime being committed – REPORT IT!



- 311 – Non-Emergency situations that may necessitate a police response.
- 911 – An EMERGENCY requiring immediate POLICE, FIRE, or MEDICAL response. If a crime is taking place, about to occur, or just happened and the suspect is nearby or recently fled. This also applies to a fire or a medical emergency.

MODIFICATIONS TO YOUR PROPERTY

Have you recently moved to the Summerlin West Community Association? Are you planning on making any modifications to your property? Please review the following from your Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Reservations.

Section 1.12 Improvement and Alterations says in part... ***“There shall be no excavation, construction, alteration or erection of any Improvement (including any projection) which in any way alters the exterior appearance of any... existing Improvement ... or any portion of a Lot without the prior approval of the Design Review Committee...”***

Plans must be submitted to the Design Review Committee for any modification being made to the exterior of your home, prior to any work being performed.

Section 1.15 Landscaping says in part... ***“Rear yards shall be substantially complete within one (1) year following the date of conveyance of the Lot from the Participating Builder to the first owner other than a Participating Builder”.*** This means that if you purchased your home

directly from the builder you have one (1) year from the date of close of escrow to have your rear yard substantially completed. If you are a second or subsequent owner of your home, you have one (1) year from the date the **first owner** closed of escrow from the builder (see previous sentence). The Association will approve two (2) inches of decorative landscape rock covering all areas of bare dirt as “substantial completion” of a rear yard.

The requirement for submittal to the Design Review Committee also extends to rear yard landscaping whether it is to be homeowner or builder installed. So, if you are approaching your one-year time requirement for rear yard landscaping, please be reminded that your rear yard landscape plans also must be submitted for review prior to installation. If you installed your rear yard landscaping without first obtaining approval from the Design Review Committee, you should submit those plans as soon as possible for consideration.

The Improvement Request Form is available at 2115 Festival Plaza Drive, Suite 220, Las Vegas, NV 89135 or at **summerlink.com**. The Design Guidelines and Standards are also available online. Please be reminded that the governing documents provide for a 30-day review process starting on the date that a complete submittal (all required information needed for the review) is received by the Association. 🦋

SNWA Programs Help Combat Heat Islands

Climate experts predict that by mid-century Southern Nevada will experience more than 100 days a year with temperatures exceeding 100 degrees. This is expected to increase urban heat island conditions where surfaces and structures like block walls, asphalt, sidewalks and buildings radiate heat that has been absorbed throughout the day. This causes overnight temperatures to remain high, allowing temperatures to climb faster each day.

While the urban heat island (UHI) effect is not unique to Southern Nevada, experts agree that shade from trees and plants is one of the most effective strategies to reduce its impact. Unfortunately, some existing tree species in our valley such as the Afghan pine, purple leaf plumb, and others will struggle to adapt to the extended heat conditions expected in the future.

As a result, the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) launched a Tree Enhancement Program that offers \$100 for every new, qualifying tree planted during a grass con-



version project. The tree rebate is an additional incentive for property owners replacing grass landscapes under the SNWA's Water Smart Landscapes Rebate Program (WSL).

Since 2023, more than 5,000 new trees have been planted through the program. Once mature, these new trees will add two million square feet of additional canopy coverage to our community.

The SNWA has also funded the installation of 1,000 new trees planted in underserved areas of the community in partnership with ImpactNV, a local non-profit dedicated to enhancing Southern Nevada's long-term sustainability.

GIANT STUDENT FARMERS MARKET – TUESDAY, APRIL 22 (EARTH DAY)

On Tuesday, April 22, Downtown Summerlin hosts the semiannual Giant Student Farmers Market organized by Green Our Planet, a local nonprofit that helps schools valley-wide plant and operate teaching gardens. Taking place on The Lawn from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., this free event is the country’s largest student-run farmers market, featuring fresh produce from 60 school gardens across Southern Nevada.

More than 600 student “farmpreneuers” will be on hand to sell herbs, vegetables, fruits, and crafts from their school gardens to the public, with all proceeds going directly to participating school garden programs. While growing food, students also learn financial literacy skills and create business plans to carry out at the Giant Student Farmers Market. During the market, they’re matched with local Southern Nevada bankers who coach them through customer service and negotiation as they sell their produce and handmade crafts to the community. In Summerlin, Green Our Planet is actively involved in assisting several community schools with their gardens funded by Howard Hughes.

TOUR DE SUMMERLIN, SATURDAY, APRIL 26

Tour de Summerlin®, Southern Nevada’s longest-running cycling event and a USA Today top 10 cycling event in both 2023 and 2024, returns to the community on Saturday, April 26. Presented by Howard Hughes, Tour de Summerlin is expected to draw more than 750 cyclists.

Now celebrating its 23rd year, Tour de Summerlin offers three distances—80 miles, 40 miles, and 20 miles—catering to all skill levels. The start times begin at 7 a.m., and all bike types, including e-bikes, are permitted. All registered participants will receive a t-shirt and medal. 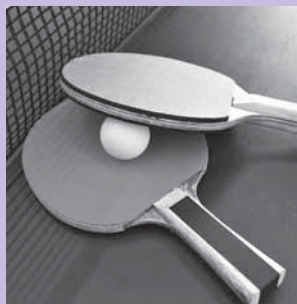
